Opportunities Abound: Don't Squander Them!

PP Ruy forwarded me an August 8th WSJ article, "Companies Thought They Had Plans for Fall. Now They Are Scrapping Them". I would like to share some thoughts on the **impacts of the pandemic that have plunged the world into a recession.**

With the NCR region under ECQ anew, the IATF has restricted the public to essential activities. Countless small businesses continue to grind to a halt. Businesses are seeing fewer orders as shopping AND demand for nonessential goods have generally dwindled. How long the pain will last remains an open question. If you are not doing even the basics of digital marketing, it's best not to further delay this initiative. After implementing cost-cutting measures, and the business is still in the red, then, you most likely you have to downsize.

Opportunity During a Recession

Faced with a sagging economy, could be the best time to get rid of dead wood. Let go the wrong people that's holding back your business; regardless of how close they may be to you. Are you and your managers spending an inordinate amount of time in rework, dealing with the same recurring problems, putting out fires created by these wrong people?

Your right people don't get along with your wrong people as often times they are carrying the load of the wrong people. Make sure the right people in your business, particularly those in leadership roles are not the ones taking the voluntary early retirement packages. Once there is a disproportionate percentage of wrong people in your business, it might well trigger an exodus of your right people; and before long, you may find your business be on a DOWNWARD SPIRAL.

Can you RETRENCH during a lockdown? Section 189 of the Labor Relations Act 66 permits employers to dismiss employees based on economic needs of the employer. You will be best served to be diligent in documenting employee infractions and never failing to follow the "due process" principle. Of course, consult a labor lawyer!

Opportunity as The Economy Recovers

Upgrade your talent pool and redesign jobs to be more engaging for the right people. Opportunities to hire re-trenched talent may be valuable just as the economy starts to turn around. For example, the massive downsizing in the lifestyle sector has made available a large pool of educated travel and leisure professionals who until that time, might not have considered jobs outside their previous industries.

In the mid 1990's, I was working for the IBM Company in New York. Facing a deteriorating financial performance, IBM approached downsizing by redesigning roles and responsibilities to improve cross-functional alignment and reduce duplication. This resulted in a more collaborative environment, helped increase employee satisfaction and productivity. Another key factor for IBM's success was maintaining training and development programs which provided the necessary skills to perform in the redesigned jobs - a significant contributor to safeguarding morale and in sustaining long-term productivity.

It is timely that next Thursday, while we are on lockdown we have the opportunity to hear the insights of Paolo Borromeo, CEO of Ayala Healthcare on what is in store for us moving forward. He will share about the pandemic as well as lessons and best practices on navigating our businesses in these uncertain times. Don't miss it! As always, let us live our RCMW theme this year, "increase our capacity to serve" with the 3Rs: Recognize, Retain and Recruit!

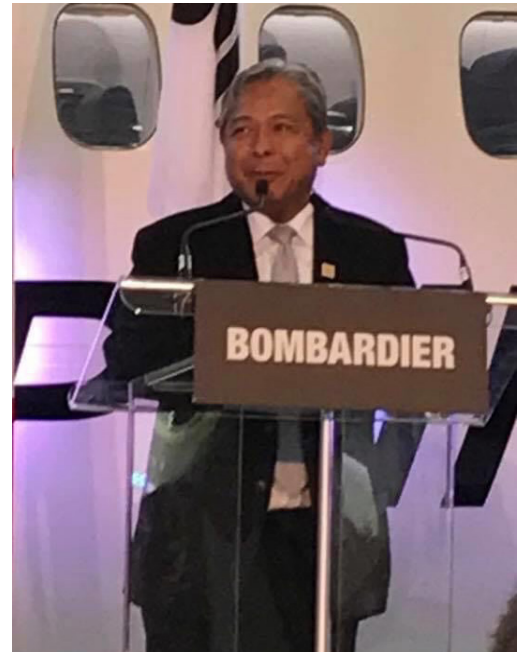

Did You Know... August is National Language Month, “Buwan ng Wikang Pambansa”?

This is the subject of Proclamation No. 1041 signed by former President Fidel V. Ramos on July 15, 1997.

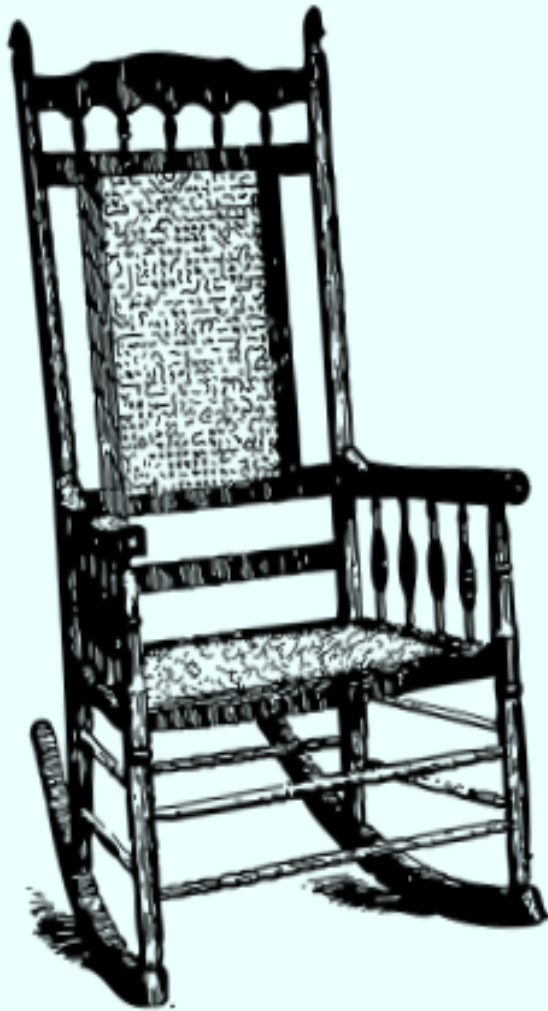
The celebration coincides with the birth month of the late President Manuel L. Quezon, known as the father of the Philippine national language, who was born on Aug. 19, 1878. In a speech delivered on December 30th 1937, from the Malacanan Palace President Quezon announced the creation of a National Language.

Starting this month, we will share Pilipino Idiomatic Expressions (idioms) “Kawikaang Pilipino”. Let’s be proud of our Wikang Pilipino!

Idiomatic Expressions for the week:

1. “Makati ang paa” (literally, foot is itchy). It means some one who’s always itching to go somewhere else. May happen during a lockdown.
2. Matalas ang dila (Sharp-tongued). Someone whose words can seriously hurt.
3. Manigas ka! (Stiffen up). Go die! / Drop dead! / Like hell, I will!. “There’s no way I’m going to do that even if you dropped dead in front of me.

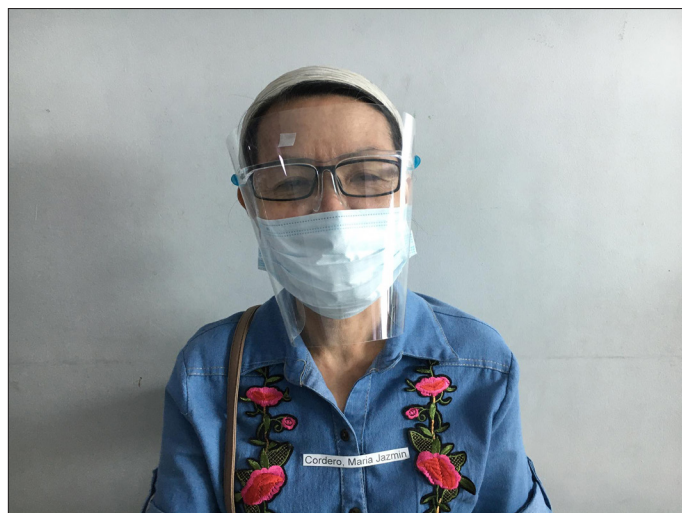

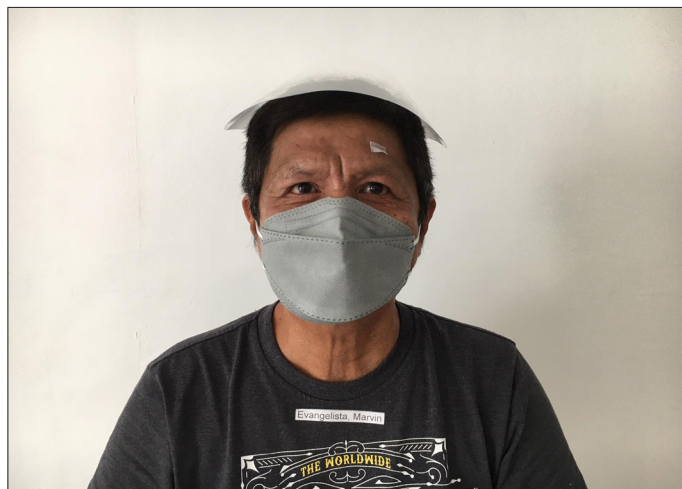

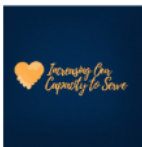
