GET TO KNOW YOUR...HOME CLUSTERS

1. WHY HAS THE CLUB FORMED HOME CLUSTERS?

During the pandemic it's been difficult to fellowship with one another. The regular weekly meeting has very limited participation to just a few, namely, the invocator, introducer, moderator and members that ask questions mostly from just a few from the guest speaker.

To make up for the lack of face-to-face fellowship, eight home clusters were established consisting of about a dozen members that live in close proximity to each other. The home cluster meeting attended by a small of group of members provides more members the opportunities to share with one another.

2. WHY ARE HOME CLUSTERS ORGANIZED GEOGRAPHICALLY?

Clusters are geographically organized so that when face-to-face small gatherings are eventually allowed and members become increasingly comfortable to fellowship, home clusters will find it easy to get together if they live close by. For the foreseeable future, home cluster meetings will be limited to mostly zoom meetings.

3. WHAT'S THE PURPOSE OF THE HOME CLUSTER?

A home cluster provides a platform to find out current news about members so they can be recognized. The cluster may organize activities as a group. Likewise, home clusters and participate in a friendly competition with other clusters to view to be the home cluster with best attendance in regular weekly meetings or the home cluster can vie to be the home cluster with the most Non- Fungible Tokens. Home clusters are also able to celebrate the success of cluster members and celebrate the success of the cluster over some beer and wine.

4. HOW OFTEN WILL HOME CLUSTERS MEET?

The frequency of home cluster meetings is to be determined by the home cluster members. To reap the benefits of the home cluster, a minimum of quarterly home cluster meetings is encouraged.





I've found that the one certainty of "giving back" is that one actually always receives more than one gives. At RCMW, the two projects that have personally meant most to me have been the Breast and Cervical Cancer Screening project led by Lito Mercado, and the Gift of Life.

My wife died from breast cancer, and the BCCS project connected me in the club to many fellow members whose family members have had to deal with these cancers. The project brought many of us to be closer to each other and I certainly feel that if we stop or help even one lady from going through the worst of these diseases, then our efforts are fully repaid. Of course, being Makati West this project has also been very sociable, with a golf round usually tagged on to the project activity.

My sister died as a baby from congenital hear problems, so Gift of Life has always resonated with me. The death of a child has very long lasting and extensive impact on any family. So saving these lives has ripples across time that we cannot understand. The most gratifying part in donating to our GOL projects and being a Guardian Angel, apart from the joyous hugs of our beneficiaries, has been the tears of happiness on my own mother's face.

I really do think finding the personal connection in our projects is so important.


