SCOTCH CORNER

Today's phrase is:

“Ceilidh” (kei-lee)

A ceilidh is a traditional evening of dance, music and song which remains highly popular among Scots both home and abroad. Scottish country dancing is taught as part of the PE program in schools, and most of us can stumble across the floor at a wedding in a vague rendition of a “Dashing White Sergeant”, a “Gay Gordons”, a “Canadian Barn Dance” or a “Strip the Willow”.

When I was at university, the evening choice was often between a nightclub or a ceilidh, with the latter almost always winning on the basis of the sheer fun to be had. Usually there is a band with accordion, drums, fiddles, flutes, and if you bring your own along you'll be most welcome to join in. Similarly, if you fancy singing a song, or orating a poem during the quiet moments, folks will happily listen to you. Multi-generational in nature, they bring people of all types together.

Scottish Heritage

Glenfiddich

Founder William Grant built the original Glenfiddich distillery in 1886 with his own hands. The name is Gaelic for “Valley of the Deer”, which is presumably where the iconic stag logo comes from. The distillery is one of the few to remain in the original family hands, with the Grant family zealously proud of its independence to this day.

Situated in the lovely village of Dufftown on Speyside, it is well worth a visit if you are on a tour of the Highlands. So is the local golf course, which has an honesty box to receive your green fee and where it feels like the first 12 holes are all uphill!

Glenfiddich was the whisky at the heart of the malt revolution in the USA during the 1960s (prior to that, almost all Scotch sold overseas was blended), and to this day is instantly recognisable for its unique triangular bottle, which was introduced at that time.

Tasting Note by The Chaps at Master of Malt

Nose: Grain. Slightly floral, mineralic. Spirity, orchard fruit, malty, honey. Citrus develops.

Palate: Light, floral, spices. Very smooth.

Finish: Sweet, touch of oak and general fruit, oily.

Overall: Stereotypical Speyside. Consistent - a good benchmark.

ABOUT THE GUEST SPEAKER



MR. RICO M. HIZON

Rico Hizon is the award-winning news anchor of CNN PHILIPPINES' evening primetime general news program THE FINAL WORD weeknights at 9pm and the weekly business and finance program THE EXCHANGE on Fridays at 8pm.

Rico moved back to Manila 6 months ago, after 25 years of international broadcasting experience in Hong Kong, Singapore and London. For 7 1/2 years he was with the global business and finance network CNBC and for the last 17 1/2 years with international news network BBC WORLD NEWS.

In his 25 years as an international broadcast journalist, he is the only South East Asian male anchor to work for two of the world's most prestigious global news networks CNBC Business News and BBC World News and as he moved back to the Philippines, joined another powerhouse international news network in CNN Philippines.

On BBC World News, Rico anchored the business news program, Asia Business Report and general news based show Newsday live from Singapore and London, every weekday morning. Produced out of Singapore, Asia Business Report offers viewers up to the minute economic and market news from the Asia-Pacific region, with in-depth analysis of the latest trends from the movers and shakers in the business world.

His reports have taken him all over the region from Hong Kong, to Indonesia, Japan, South Korea, Thailand, Malaysia, Australia and the Philippines. On Newsday, Rico reported on the latest

political and social issues from the people who make the news, and also a thorough viewpoint from more than 200 BBC correspondents around the world, and its impact on the global scene.

Rico a TOYM (The Outstanding Young Men) awardee is multi-awarded broadcast journalist. He was conferred the Responsible Broadcast Journalist Award from the Rotary Club. His global news show Newsday won the 2017 Asian Television Award for Best News Program. In 2014, he won the Highly Commended Award in the Best News Anchor category at the Asian Television Awards. He garnered in 2012, the prestigious Rotary Club of Manila, Broadcast Journalist of the Year Award and was accorded a Doctorate Honoris Causa in Humanities by the University of Northeastern Philippines. In 2011, he was chosen one of Asia's top news anchor's at the Asian Television Awards. In 2010, People of the Year Awardee from People Asia Magazine. In 2009, a La Sallian Achievement Awardee for Global Journalism. In 2008, Presidential Awardee for excellence in International Journalism. In 2008, Bank of the Philippine Islands recognized Hizon for bringing honor and recognition to the Philippines with the BPinoy Award, and for advocating important Filipino values and principles.

Hizon, who studied at De La Salle University, started his broadcast career at Manila-based GMA Network, from 1988 to 1995, where he was responsible for covering capital markets, banking and finance, real estate, investment and corporate developments. He anchored the daily business program, Business Today, GMA News Live and Stock Market Live from the trading floor of the Philippine Stock Exchange.

Hizon then joined CNBC Asia in April 1995, based in Hong Kong and later in Singapore, where he was the main anchor of the morning edition of CNBC Today, Squawk Box, Market Watch and Power Lunch.
