APOSTOLIC NUNCIO TO THE PHILIPPINES

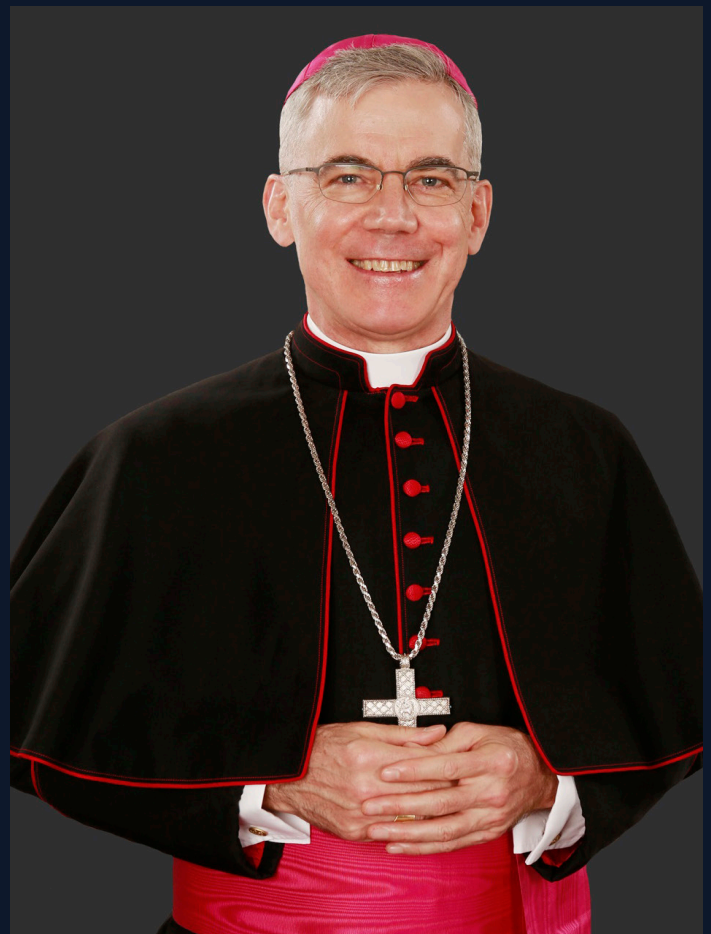
Rev. Charles John Brown is an American prelate of the Roman Catholic Church who has been serving as an apostolic nuncio since 2012.

He has been appointed apostolic nuncio to the Philippines in 2020. Prior to this, he served as apostolic nuncio in Ireland, then in Albania.

Before entering the diplomatic service of the Holy See, Brown worked at the Congregation for the Doctrine of the Faith in Vatican City State.

After being ordained to the priesthood in Saint Patrick's Cathedral for the Archdiocese of New York in 1989, Brown served as parochial vicar in Saint Brendan's Church in Bronx.

He earned his doctorate degree in Sacred Theology from the Pontificio Ateneo Sant'Anselmo in Rome.

Today I'd like to talk about proactive business model-altering step change and diversity, as an action.

I note the definition of step change is a sudden or major change in the way something happens or the way that someone behaves and diversity, a range of many people or things that are very different from each other.

I've stridently advocated for both, over a considerable period.

Slow adoption of operational change never ends well and an energetic acceptance of people with different experiences and skills always drives sustainable growth.

I suggest to you we've all been sluggish, lacking energy or alertness surrounding the consideration or hiring of people, from different parts of the world, who possess in-demand skills.

Prior to the pandemic, talent with expertise in data or behavioural science, AI and machine learning, to name but a few, would not, in their wildest dreams consider working for say a manufacturing firm in the Philippines.



Now, as we've all learnt to work from anywhere, if we put our mind to it, we can positively utilise these diversely skilled people, remote freelancers, to work for your company.

Consulting firms, like Deloitte seem more adept at embracing change, different ways of working and diversity (of skills), than most, I guess, as you'd expect.

Over recent years (prior to COVID-19), Deloitte leveraged open talent and crowd sourcing to meet clients' evolving needs.

If I could be so bold as to say, like Deloitte, many of you are no doubt growing your revenues, at unprecedented levels; though whilst they lean into operational change, many of us remain comfortable with the status-quo. Consulting firms, being in their nature, anticipate change in their industry; whilst many of us tend to wait and react when we notice revenues start trending south.

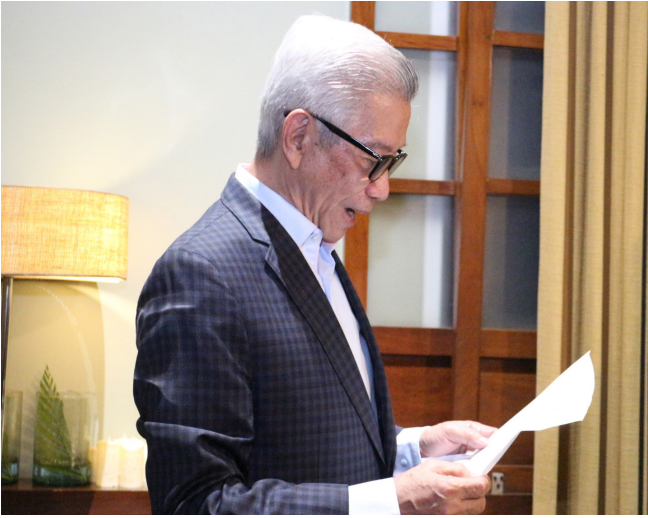

“Kanlungan” means sanctuary or refuge. It makes me think of a child safely seated in the lap of a loving parent.

This safe space is exactly what is needed by the children in Kanlungan sa Er-Ma. Young as they are, they have already gone through unspeakable abuses and had to be brought to this second home for protection.

Kanlungan sa Er-Ma was established in 1988 when Ermita and Malate became the center of the red-light district of Manila. There was a growing number of street children in these areas who were being abused and exploited by both locals and foreigners.

Kanlungan is a small three-story house that is hidden in the narrow roads of Manila. Protection, education, counseling, recreational activities, legal help, training for parents, etc. are some of the services they offer for the children. It currently houses 10 children from ages of 5 to 15 years old. Three more children were expected to arrive, but their trip was delayed by the recent typhoon.

Spouses Shiela Carlos, Nikki Jimenez and I went to Kanlungan last October 30 for a little party and All Saints' Day celebration. Nikki brought Lito who gave the children an impromptu inspirational talk about how they can be whoever they dream to be.

Sheila brought her sister, kids, nephew, and nieces to lend their youthful energy to the party. They came prepared with entertainment numbers and a sharing on the lives of their favorite saints. They joined the games and cheered for their favorite team!

We brought two clowns who made us laugh with their magic tricks. The kids, in turn, prepared song and dance numbers for us. It was touching to hear them sing about God's love knowing that God's presence and love may be the first thing that they will doubt given their sad experiences.

The Rotary Anns generously contributed to this outreach. The children received two big bags of goodies with candies, activity books and everyday needs which Sheila packed in "scary" Halloween bags. Sheila went to Divisoria and bought warm hoodies for all of the kids. Even the caregivers didn't escape her attention and also had gifts. Kanlungan also received rice and laundry soap. Two sacks of rice were hauled by Lito and Nikki from Alabang!

When we first arrived, there was a boy who didn't want to join the party. He was just in the room but would peep at what was going on. The caregivers commented "May S". I thought to myself that maybe it was not easy for him to trust strangers. Later on, he quietly joined the party and we eventually saw him jumping around and shrieking with happiness. It takes so little of our time and effort to reach out to others and spread some joy!

As we bade goodbye, we reflected on how blessed we all are. So much happiness and love went around that afternoon and the lines between giver and receiver were once again blurred.





Challenge to President Gil Chua By: IPP Franco del Rosario November 7th, 2022

As is customary in our club as the immediate past president, I have the unenviable task to throw a challenge to our president. How the heck do you challenge our president who is continuously raising the standards of our club?

Since assuming the presidency of Makati West he has been outdoing himself over and over. Gosh, non-stop like a 7-11 store. He never closes. And to think this was the same guy who told me last year, "Franco, you are trying to do too much".

What do I admire about Pres. Gil Garcia Chua? I will exceed the allotted time to me if I name everything. So, suffice it to say I admire this guy's charisma. He has a disarming smile. Man, how can you not love this guy?

During the weekly meeting Thursday, Gov. Jay mentioned a challenge which is a recurring challenge for all club presidents. His challenge is about engaging inactive members.

specifically mentioned the president doing a one-to-one lunch meeting is the most effective way to contain the risk of inactive members leaving.

You would obviously be thinking to yourself as I did last year, "Geez, I have no time for this with all the stuff going on in our club!" So, I wanted to delegate to the board, meeting one-on-one with inactive members. I was rebuked by my club advisers and explained to me that delegating one-on-one meeting with inactive members may not work as it would not be nearly as impactful, and this was an honor exclusive for the club president.

Unfortunately, meeting one-on-one with inactive members has a life that extends to the end of the rotary year. Every rotary year, there continues to be the risk of losing inactive members. So much for the first challenge.

Another challenge is with this year's theme in mind – imagine. We had a guest speaker, Piki Lopez, CEO of First Philippine Holdings.

Piki refers to the Climate Change Commission (CCC) that the Philippines is one of the countries at greatest risk to climate related hazards including increased temperature, wetter wet seasons and drier dry seasons, frequency, and intensity of extreme weather events. And we have in fact lived through numerous category 5 super typhoons, Ondoy, Ulysees, Rolly, Odette, among others.

Let me quote from Piki, "...for businesses to thrive by accelerating climate crisis, they must be able to reimagine and redesign themselves for this new world...one mindset that needs to change only if the pain of not changing is no longer bearable. Doing so, it will be way too late, as by then our planet will no longer be livable..."

What is concerning is 75% of water bottles are not recycled - they end up in landfills, litter roadsides, and pollute waterways and oceans. Each bottle leaks harmful chemicals into our environment along the way as it decomposes. Pres. Gil, perhaps you could get behind and kick-start a campaign on anti-single use plastic.

Let's bring this down to us here in the Philippines. It is amazing that every day, almost 48 million shopping bags are used throughout the Philippines: that's roughly 17.5 billion pieces a year.

What is concerning is 75% of water bottles are not recycled - they end up in landfills, litter roadsides, and pollute waterways and oceans. Each bottle leaks harmful chemicals into our environment along the way as it decomposes. Pres. Gil, perhaps you could get behind and kick-start a campaign on anti-single use plastic. This maybe in conjunction with your team at DDB Group, with our district getting more clubs involved, and broaden our reach by exploring partnerships with Philippine companies with a climate change advocacy?

In closing, we'd all agree everything Pres. Gil touches turns to gold, whether it's his business – DDB Group Philippines – who continue to garner local and global recognition, such as the "Best Companies to Work for in Asia 2022" by HR Asia and the Filipino Executive of the Year by the Asia CEO Awards, among others.

Thanks Pres. Gil, we are secure that our club is in the best of hands and with your leadership our club is on the path to be even stronger, and the undisputed best club in the Philippines.

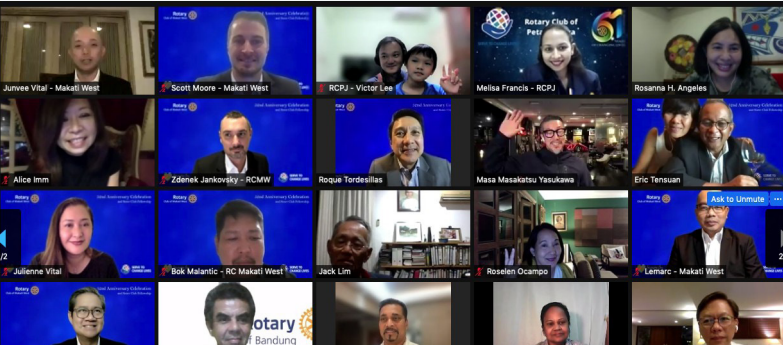
