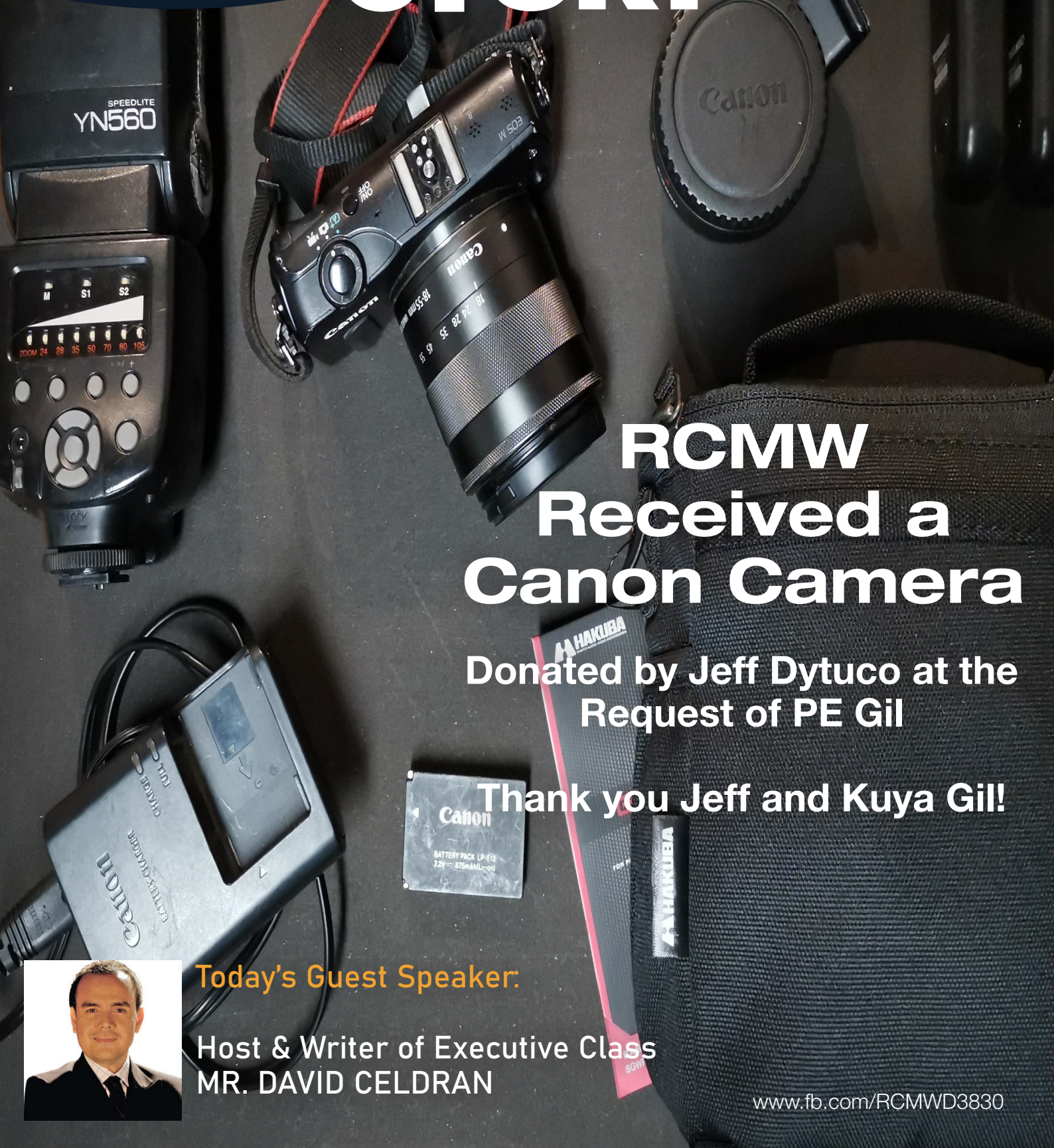

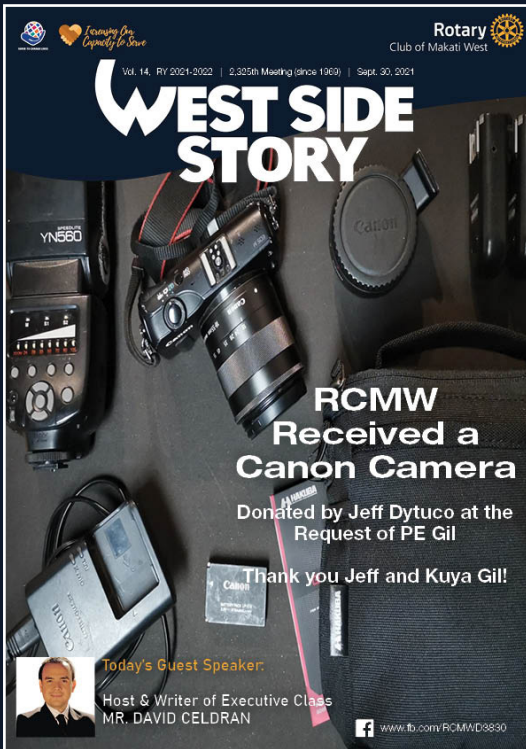

David has covered Philippine politics and society as a broadcast producer, reporter, anchor and freelance writer for various TV news organizations and news publications. He was also the former Chairman of the Philippine Center for Investigative Journalism (PCIJ) which advocates press freedom, media literacy and investigative journalism.

He continues to contribute to local publications and international journals on topics such as popular culture, media, retail and technology. David has provided analyses on the Philippines for international news agencies and publications such as CNN, BBC, The New York Times and Monocle Magazine, and has lectured on media, technology and culture in local and international conferences. David travels regularly around the world and maintains an interest in the socio-economic changes taking place across the globe. The current focus of his work is on urban culture, media and consumer trends.

Among his various roles in media was his position as Editor-in-Chief of 'Vault,' an award-winning lifestyle magazine published by ABS-CBN and the program host of 'Battle of Brains,' a popular intercollegiate quiz show that aired on RPN-9.

He is currently the host and head writer of the multi-awarded business and lifestyle program 'Executive Class' on ABS-CBN News Channel as well as a regular contributor on cultural trends to abs-cbnnews.com.





PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

Leveraging Strengths: Your Key to Exceptional Performance

"I remained focus and determined to improve every single day together with #TeamHD who prepared me." - Hidilyn Diaz

A widely held false belief is that we will grow the most in our areas of greatest weakness. The truth is we will grow the most in our areas of greatest strength and interest. In fact, we are the most inquisitive, most resilient and most creative in our areas of strength. But often, the fundamental problem is the employee is wrong for the job. The best match is a job that for the most part plays to the strengths (not the weaknesses) of the employee.

The question to ask is, how much time and effort is being devoted to finding the right people? Often, a candidate's profile checks all the right boxes except that the culture fit is a question mark. This becomes applicable, "...When in doubt, don't hire..." - Jim Collins, Author, *Good to Great*. The culture the company has built is integral to its success. Collins

says the candidate must share the core values of the company, as you can't give people new core values halfway through life. Nothing can throw off that culture faster than hiring the wrong person, especially for a leadership position.

According to Chip Anderson, UCLA Professor, "Strengths are a collection of personal qualities, abilities, and talents that enable a person to do certain things very well. Many strengths all working together, are needed to produce outstanding performance."

Another myth is “a good team member does whatever it takes to help the team.” This is false. A good team member deliberately volunteers his strengths to the team. In fact, **“A great team member is not well rounded. The great team is well rounded, precisely because each great team member is not.”** - **Marcus Buckingham.** The Gallup organization found that when you look closely at the most effective teams, they discovered the players on these teams were not in themselves well rounded.

True teamwork occurs only when a complimentary set of strengths comes together in a coordinated whole. The challenge in trying to achieve this is it requires a leader who has an eye for each person's unique configuration of strengths and weaknesses. You may recall from our recent Shackleton forum, how Sir Ernest selected the South Georgia boat party.

Our teammates need to know where they can rely on us the most, and our strengths are the answer.

The responsible team members are not chipping in and doing whatever the team requires of them. Instead, they have taken it upon themselves to seek out others on the team who are strong where they are weak; and figure out how to arrange their role that plays to their strengths most of the time.

You cannot be anything you want to be – but you can be a lot more of who you already are.” – **Tom Rath, Author, Strengths Finder 2.0.** This book measures the thirty-four most enduring and influential talent themes that make “the best of the best” highly effective. One of the themes is “Focus” and is described as, “People strong in the Focus theme can take direction, follow through, and make the corrections necessary to stay on track. They prioritize, then act.

Hidilyn Diaz won a silver medal in the 2016 Summer Olympics and then went on to win the gold in 2021 because she was focused. How? Owing to the pandemic, while Hidilyn was stuck in Malaysia for months with no open gyms, she improvised and built her own gym, training with very little professional equipment. In Hidilyn's words. “...I remained focus and determined to improve every single day together with #TeamHD who prepared me...”

Hidilyn was aligned with Rath's “Focus” theme, taking direction from her team and made corrective measures, to stay on track in her quest for gold. She prioritized, then acted.

Gallup surveyed more than 10 million people on the topic of how positive people are at work, and only one-third “strongly agree” with the statement: “At work, I have the opportunity to do what I do best every day.” I am willing to bet David Celdran, our speaker, today would have answered “strongly agree.”

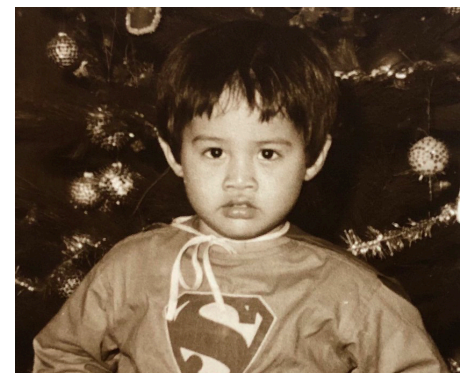

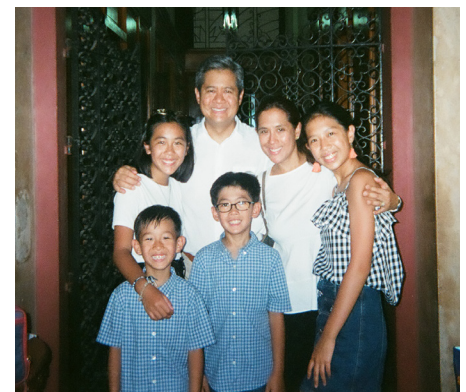

Q: Am I obligated to help my ward financially?

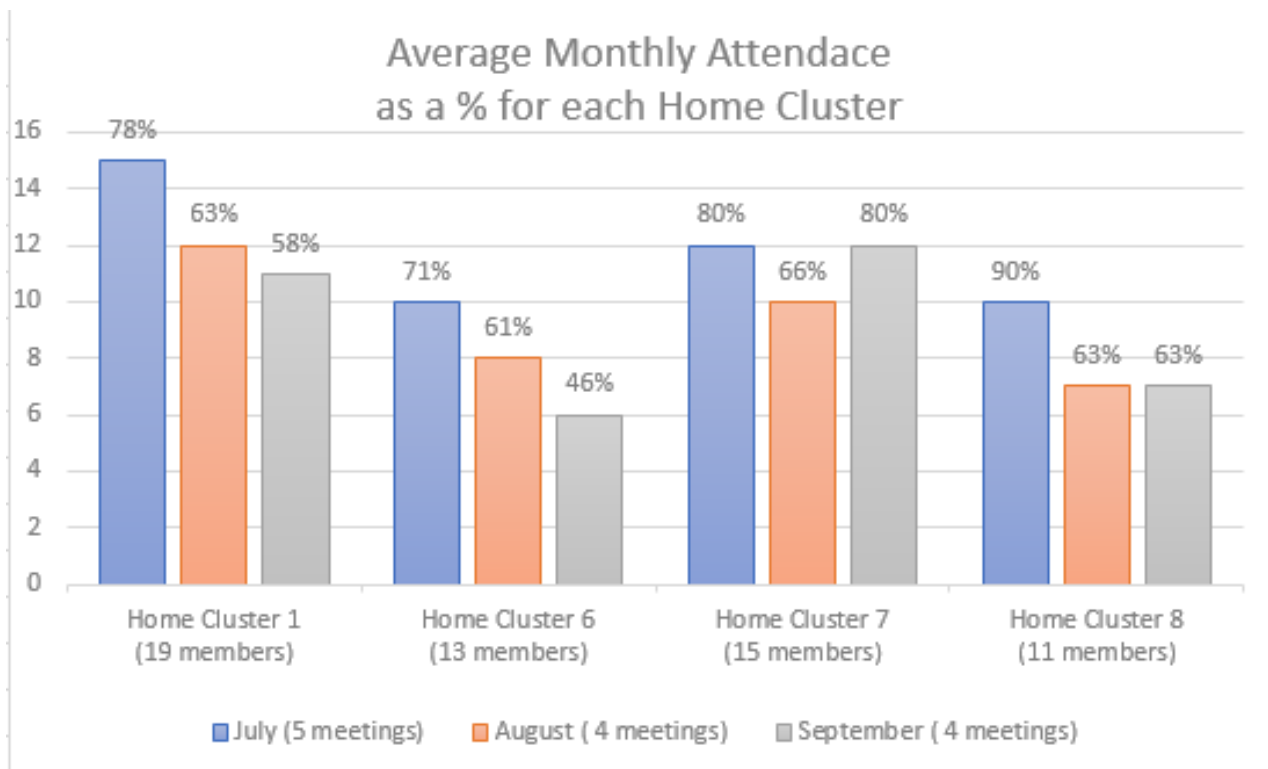
A: There is no obligation to provide any financial assistance to your ward.

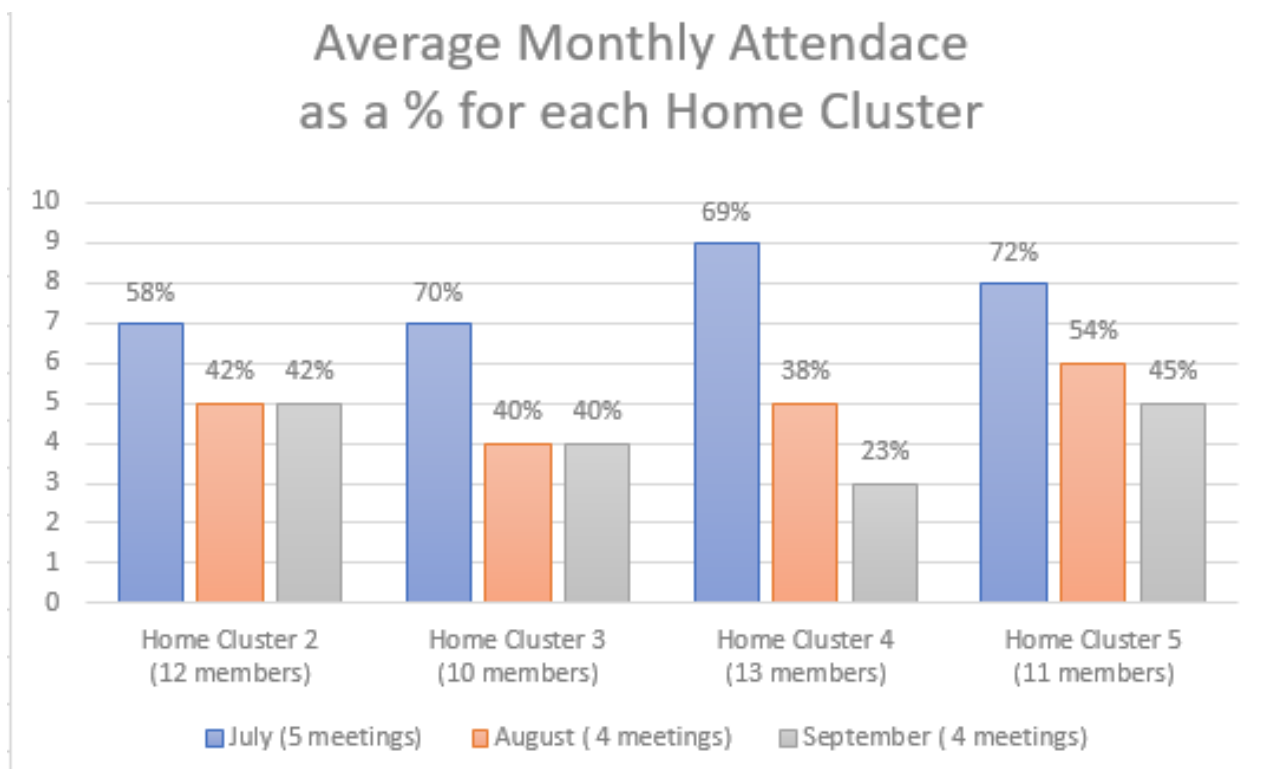

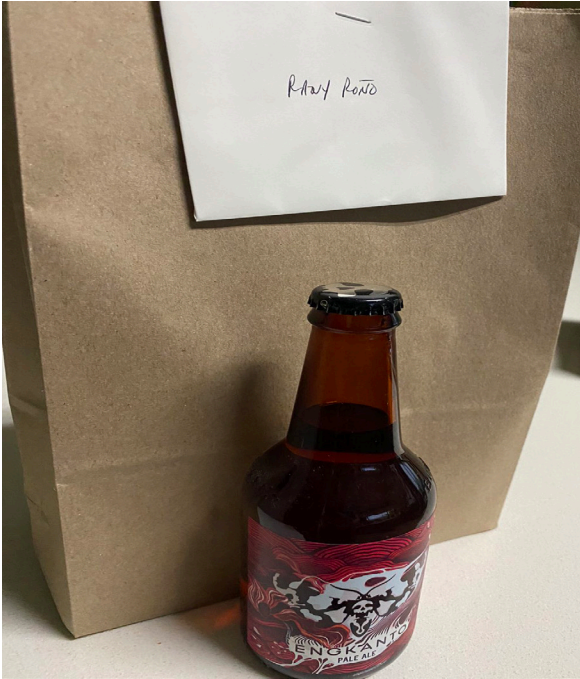

RCMW MEMBERSHIP APPLICATION PROCESS

PROPOSING A NEW MEMBER

A step-by-step guide

01

Club members/sponsors identify prospective members believed to be of good character and a good fit for membership in RCMW

02

The sponsors introduce the prospective members to our Club by sharing with them about:

Their experience as a Member

Why they joined and why they have stayed with the club

Our club's projects and activities and its impact to the club members and the community

How they can get involved in club activities

Invite the prospective member to attend a combination of at least 3 Thursday weekly meetings and Fireside chat

If the prospective member shows interest and is deemed to be a good fit, the sponsoring member should request for a copy of the bio data and submit to the Club Secretary through the club Secretariat for immediate circulation to the board members and club advisers.

03

If there are no objections from any of the Board members and club advisers after a 10 day posting, it is posted to the entire membership for another 10 days, for a total 20 days posting period. If no objection is received, the prospective member is then accepted and attends an onboarding orientation.

04

The prospective member pays the pro-rata annual dues shortly after receiving an invoice from the club.

05

The prospective member is inducted after making at least a partial dues payment.

06

The Club Secretary or President immediately reports the new member to Rotary International.

QUALIFICATIONS OF MEMBERS

1. A member should be an adult person of good character, good business, professional, with good community reputation.
2. Engaged as a proprietor, partner, corporate officer, or manager of any worthy and recognized business or profession.
3. Holding an important position in any worthy and recognized business or profession in an executive capacity is preferred but not mandatory.
4. Retired from business or profession mentioned in 2 and 3 above.
5. A community leader who has demonstrated through personal involvement in community affairs with a commitment to service and the object of Rotary.

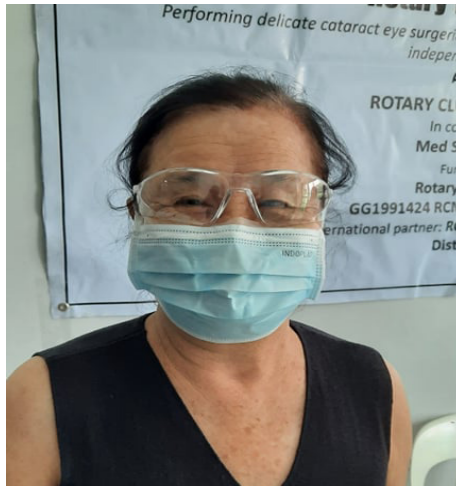

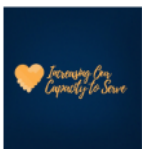
