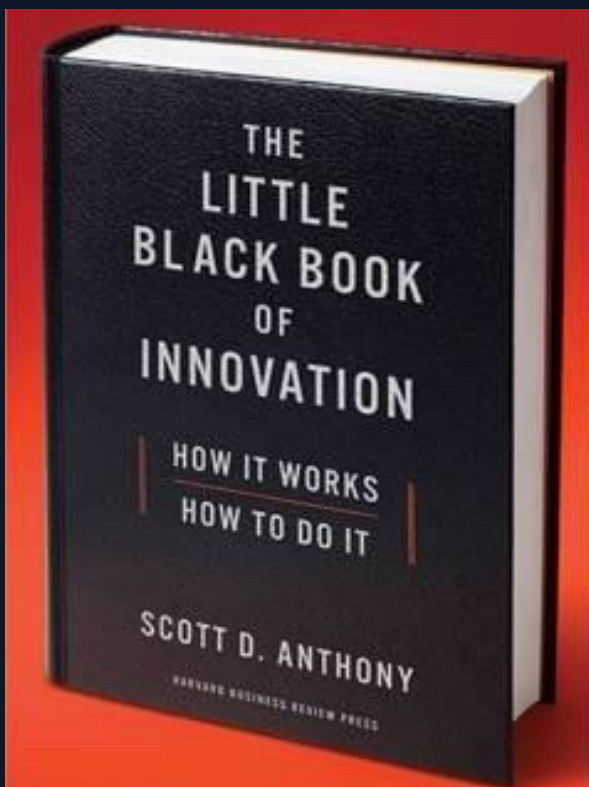

PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

SOCIAL MEDIA IS TEARING OUR COUNTRY APART?

“The irony of our times: the more you know, the less you trust.” – David Celdran

David Celdran brilliantly explained why we're now living in a somewhat dark, confusing and toxic age of fake news, conspiracy theories, trolls posting inflammatory messages in social media playing on fear and anger, with the effect of dividing people and possibly even tearing our country apart.

I am devoting this piece to share David's message to all those that missed his talk on Social Media (SM) and its impact on just about everything in our daily lives. He says SM fragments society into separate silos of moral and political beliefs while giving public access and control over the dissemination of information; and therein lies the problem.

David says, “...When the public has equal access, then any side of the political divide can use it to achieve their own version of change...In effect, SM builds parallel worlds of truth that divide the public...”

As an example, David pointed to political and media elites that were caught by surprise when DU30 won in 2016; which highlighted the ability of the “masa” to challenge the worldview, morality, and the political power of the elites in public.

I concur with David's view, when we feel threatened, we retreat into our comfort zones of private chat groups (PCGs). David calls PCGs "...echo chambers of like-minded people of the same ethnic origin, social class or educational background...They are the ultimate reflection of our society's fragmentation which alienates us from each other..."

PCGs are safe havens, where we tend to be more trusting of one another; where our views harden and become "holier-than-thou". Corollary, the closer we feel people are to us, the more we trust them and rarely question their views. David says that **PCGs reinforces each other's insecurities and fears; giving rise to a false sense of superiority, and may actually encourage ignorance and apathy towards others.**

I believe that lockdowns have significantly increase in the number of PCG's. Even within our club, we have our own bubble, namely the secure and secret "RCMW Chat". Sadly, I see other PCGs venting out and poking fun at the government's ineptness by mocking with non-value adding, contemptuous comments like, "only in the Philippines"; which do nothing but fuel anger and disillusionment. Thankfully, I don't recall seeing this kind of rhetoric in our PCG as our members are responsible and respectful citizens that adhere to the tenets of Rotary's 4-way test.

According to David, another significant result of SM is it has given rise to amateur "experts". Why is this scary? He says that these **"...amateur experts creates doubt in the credibility of authoritative figures giving rise to alternative authority sources – making it harder to discern between fact and fake, truth and conspiracy..."**

David illustrates his point with the raging debate about treatments for COVID, or the safety and efficacy of vaccines. "For every statement from the WHO, CDC or our own DOH, you can expect a counter-study from some professional group or "expert". Which is the factual version?". It actually boils down to who you trust more.

In closing, David provides a call to action. He urges us, one, to acknowledge our biases before accusing others. Two, verify our source before accepting it as truth and passing these on to others. Three, have an open mind and heart. As empathy is an antidote to self-righteousness, let's find common ground. Fourth, for balance, diversify our source of news and seek people that challenge our beliefs and offer opposing views. Let's think differently about collaboration and the perils of groupthink.

After David's talk, I realized how important SM is, in these days of COVID and anti-vaxxers; elections, blue ribbon investigations, climate change. Hence, all the more we need 'to be ahead' in knowledge; making it our business to study both sides of the issues and be true to our convictions and constructive in our opinions.

Our speaker next week is the Chinese International School of Manila's (CISM) Head of School, Ms Karen Jones. We have the opportunity to get insights on the Impact of prolonged online learning on our young students. Finally, Makati West Men of Zest, let's execute on our theme, "Increase Our Capacity to Serve" and remember our winning 3R's: Recognize, Retain and Recruit!

Q: What are my responsibilities as a Guardian Angel?

A: With the GAP committee providing you with information and support, to monitor the general medical status of your ward and his parents in order to ensure that the child complies with the required post operation check up's and 2D Echo 6 months and one year after their surgery.

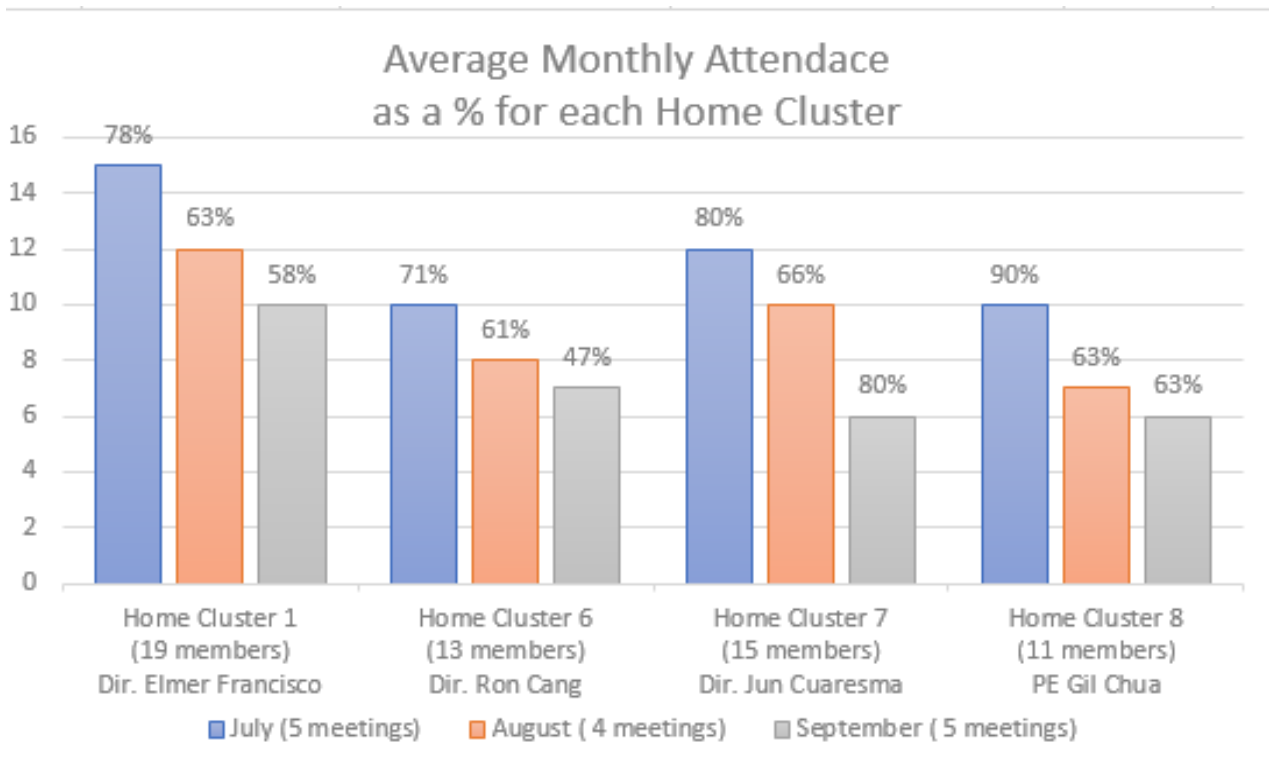
Q: Am I obligated to help my ward financially?

A: There is no obligation to provide any financial assistance to your ward.

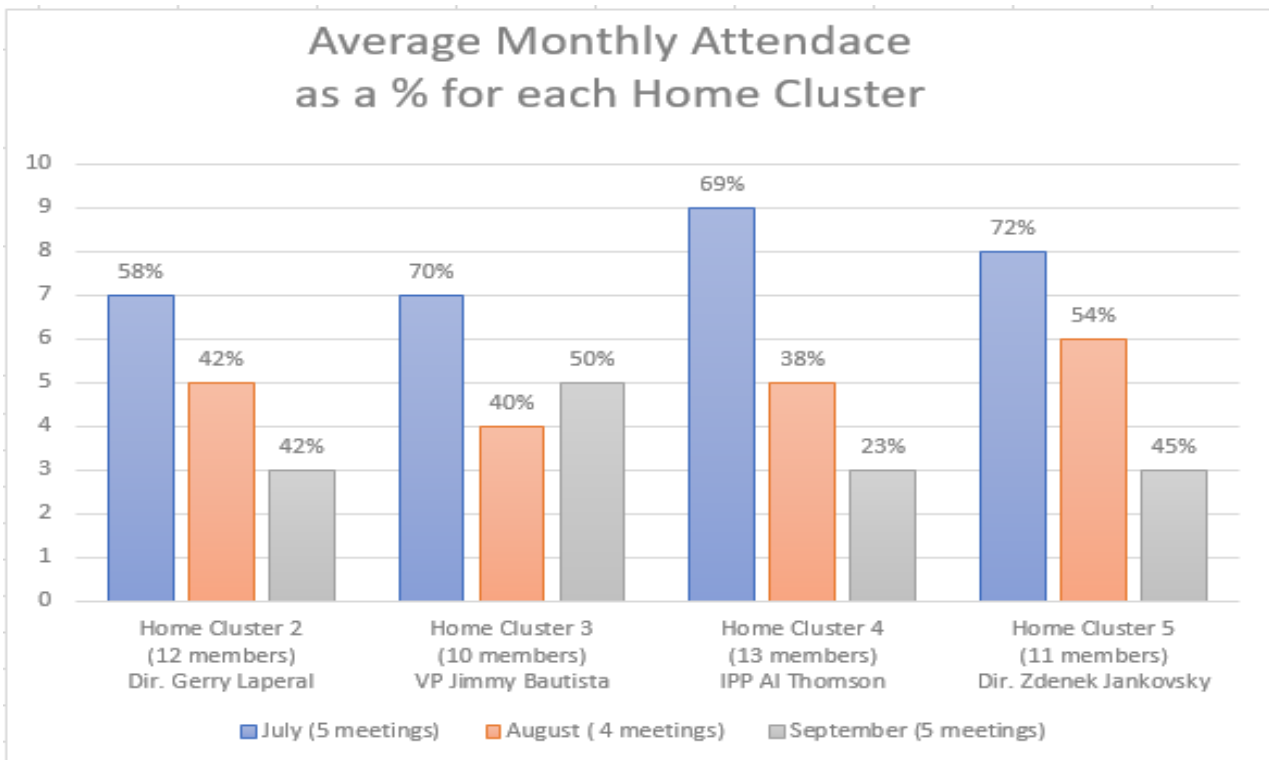

RCMW MEMBERSHIP APPLICATION PROCESS PROPOSING A NEW MEMBER A step-by-step guide

01

Club members/sponsors identify prospective members believed to be of good character and a good fit for membership in RCMW

02

The sponsors introduce the prospective members to our Club by sharing with them about:

Their experience as a Member

Why they joined and why they have stayed with the club

Our club's projects and activities and its impact to the club members and the community

How they can get involved in club activities

Invite the prospective member to attend a combination of at least 3 Thursday weekly meetings and Fireside chat

If the prospective member shows interest and is deemed to be a good fit, the sponsoring member should request for a copy of the bio data and submit to the Club Secretary through the club Secretariat for immediate circulation to the board members and club advisers.

03

If there are no objections from any of the Board members and club advisers after a 10 day posting, it is posted to the entire membership for another 10 days, for a total 20 days posting period. If no objection is received, the prospective member is then accepted and attends an onboarding orientation.

04

The prospective member pays the pro-rata annual dues shortly after receiving an invoice from the club.

05

The prospective member is inducted after making at least a partial dues payment.

06

The Club Secretary or President immediately reports the new member to Rotary International.

QUALIFICATIONS OF MEMBERS

1. A member should be an adult person of good character, good business, professional, with good community reputation.
2. Engaged as a proprietor, partner, corporate officer, or manager of any worthy and recognized business or profession.
3. Holding an important position in any worthy and recognized business or profession in an executive capacity is preferred but not mandatory.
4. Retired from business or profession mentioned in 2 and 3 above.
5. A community leader who has demonstrated through personal involvement in community affairs with a commitment to service and the object of Rotary.

SOBER OCTOBER

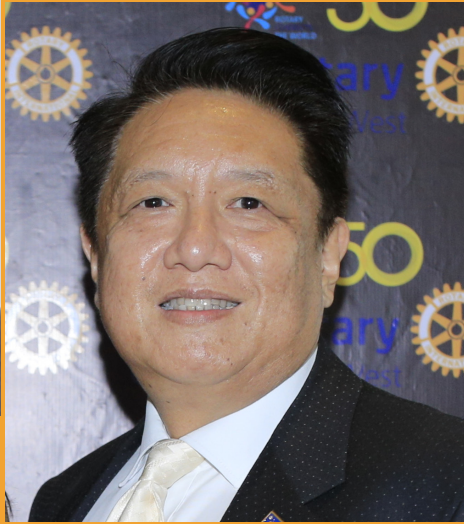

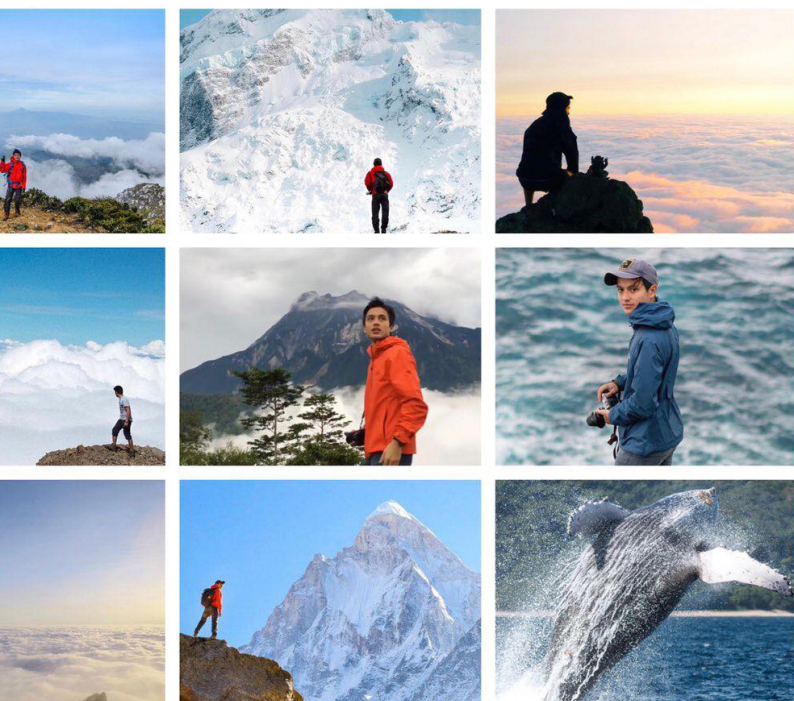

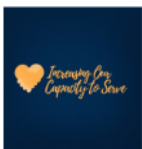
