

Fernando Contreras Jr. is a serial entrepreneur focusing on technology and technology-enabled solutions and services. His main interest is the creation and development of disruptive technology and its applications.

FORETHOUGHT

The subject of biometrics has been gripping me these past few months.

Exploring further, in 2009, India created an agency within the federal government responsible for issuing IDs to every citizen. The effort known as Aadhaar, promised to build a new digital infrastructure that would make it easier for people with no driver's licence or birth certificate to claim entitlements. In addition, the system was designed to reduce fraud, corruption and the elimination of costs associated with procuring private services ranging from bank accounts to mobile phones.

With advances in technology, Aadhaar excelled, where previous attempts by India to provide national IDs had failed. It uses biometric scans – all ten fingers and two irises – to ensure that no citizen registered for more than one ID number. This data allows government as well as private corporations to easily verify people's identity. Aadhaar's first enrollment was in 2010; now there's around 1.25 billion people with Aadhaar numbers. I note, by early 2020, a decade since inception, over 90% of India's population have Aadhaar cards.

Supporters seemingly remain unconcerned about the privacy implications as well as the wisdom of a system that centralizes so much power in the hands of government. On the other hand, vocal critics are disturbed a central data base could be hacked by criminals; not to mention worries of potential government surveillance and the potential of gaining unfair political maneuvering or advantage by the party in power.

As is the case throughout the world, technology leads; privacy laws, governance and ethics tend to lag.



To cut a long story short, in August 2017, the Supreme Court of India ruled "the right to privacy is protected as an intrinsic part of right to life and personal liberty" under the Constitution. But wait for it, government lawyers argued during the case that citizens did not have absolute rights over their bodies, allowing the government to force citizens to give their biometrics.

Brought on by the pandemic, I worry about fear and freedom.

Some countries have long been talking of vaccination verification cards, immunology testing and vaccine passports. Biometric or e-passports have been with us since 1998, though with technology advances, I see change afoot including all that Aadhaar delivers. In addition, DNA sequencing and genetic markers embedded in passports, which could certainly be accessed by governments throughout the world and, in time, by private enterprise.

As part of my biometric research, talking of tracking, from 2023 as you know, brands will no longer be able to use third-party cookies to track consumers online, so it will become harder to deliver personalized ads, and to manage campaign reach and frequency.

To my earlier discussion, an ever growing patchwork of global, national and regional data privacy regulation is giving consumers greater control over their identity. Brands with access to authenticated first-party data are best placed to thrive in a post cookie ecosystem. Brands can benefit from data partnerships with publishers, which have access to authenticated audience data.

Looking forward thoughtfully, landing this topic in the here and now, if you'd like an insightful piece on the future of identity, do let me know, and I'll send you a copy.

Whilst you absorb this Forethought, I encourage you to keep in mind the opened-ended questions the authors of the identity paper put to us for consideration.

- 1. What happens if an advertiser can't collect enough first-party data to maintain an acceptable level of marketing effectiveness?
- 2. How can brands prevent themselves from becoming overly dependent on data-rich digital platforms like Amazon, Facebook, and Google?
- 3. What can marketers do to combat customer identity fragmentation?
- 4. And what happens in the event of a data 'doomsday', when customer data pipes run dry because of changes to regulation?

A wise man once said – "Those who are going to be in business tomorrow are those who understand that the future, as always, belongs to the brave".

Rotary Anns' Outreach for Bone Cancer Patients
Philippine Orthopedic Center
November 23, 2022, Wednesday

Joaquin Mercado was diagnosed with bone cancer at the young age of 15. After surgery and endless rounds of chemotherapy, he is now navigating life as a cancer survivor and a fine young man at 21. He readily accepted the invitation of his aunt, Rotary Ann Chary Mercado to share his experiences in the outreach of the Anns to the bone cancer patients of the Philippine Orthopedic Center (POC).

Joaquin proudly wore shorts revealing a long scar on his leg. He talked about his journey, the questions, the loneliness and pain, and also of the acceptance and eventually the triumph. He encouraged the patients with the hope and reality that bone cancer can be healed. He reminded them that they were not only cancer patients but were still the other things they were before the diagnosis. Aside from being a cancer patient, Joaquin was also a teenager who loved to play video games, an honor student, one who loved to go out with friends. He still lived these other aspects of his life and refused to get overwhelmed by the cancer. It was a very inspiring talk.

Joaquin's Dad, Mark Mercado, also told the care givers to continue to inspire their children and to be the unwavering source of hope and strength for them.

While waiting for the food, Sheila Carlos gave a talk about the biblical character, Job. Job was steadfast in his faith in spite of all his suffering. Like him, we can have hope and embrace our trials as our "I love you" to The Lord. In the end, everything Job lost was given back to him in double portion.

The doctors we met were Dr. Richard Rotor, who is the Head of the POC Musculoskeletal Tumor Service, and junior consultants, Dr. Abi Tud, MD-MBA and and Dr. Daniela Carolino, MD. Dr. Abi Tud brought a technology to the Philippines from Taiwan called Cryosurgery where the bone autographs are treated with liquid nitrogen for musculoskeletal tumor surgery. She will be a speaker in our Rotary Club





in January to tell us more about this amazing technology.

We met the chemo nurses, cheerful and competent, all very caring people. All these amazing medical personnel can be elsewhere rather than in the depressing setting of a government hospital where there is always a lack of everything. Often, the doctors end up even paying for some of the expenses of their indigent patients. We saw many patients including a young boy with a missing limb. Dr. Rotor said that for many, their limbs could have been saved if they had the means to early treatment.

We met the patients, some of whom were still attached to intravenous medications. They seemed quiet at first.





They listened to the sharing, ate a simple meal with us and watched the silly clowns do their magic. Slowly they started to smile and even joined the games. Hopefully they remembered what Joaquin said and rediscovered the part of themselves that still enjoyed a crunchy chicken meal or a funny joke from an outrageously dressed clown.

My son, Igo, came along to the outreach. He was so touched and remarked, "I realized that our problems are so trivial."

Thank you to all the ladies who came and contributed to the outreach. Thank you spouses Chary Mercado, Trina Reyes, Sheila Carlos for being there. Thank you to Julienne Vital who prepared the give-aways for the patients and Chary Mercado who prepared the gift for the doctors and nurses. Thank you to the numerous and generous donations of the Rotary Anns in cash and in kind.


