Speaking of inspiration, I had the opportunity to spend the whole Sunday morning of December 4 with kids who have congenital heart disease and those with Down Syndrome who benefited from our club's Gift of Life (GOL) program. It was something that made me realize further that the club is truly making an impact in the communities with this one flagship program alone.

A total of 195 GOL kids attended this meet-and- greet Christmas outreach party of our club at the Quezon Memorial Circle. These are the kids that a group of mothers of GOL beneficiaries called "Jaden and Friends" and a group formed by their doctors called "Happy Hearts" brought to our club so that they could avail of free heart surgeries and medical assistance.

Thanks to all those who gave gifts to the kids especially our members who joined me and FL Gigi at the Quezon Memorial Circle. They were PP Lou del Rosario, the one who brought the program to the club, GOL Project Chair Gerry Limcaoco and Sps. Kathy, and our ever-supportive members Lemarc Limosnero, Charlie Rufino, and Jing Lapus. Cong. Paul Daza was also represented in the event by his relative, Paolo Daza Planas.

During this meet-and-greet, I was able to talk to one mother who told me that her family thought that there was no hope for their child to live because they could not afford the cost of heart operation and treatment. But thanks to Jaden and Friends, they were able to meet the people behind the club's Gift of Life program and their child got his



much-needed heart surgery.

Seeing how the mothers of GOL patients had organized themselves to help other children with CHD, the doctors also created the Happy Hearts Foundation. Both Jaden and Friends and Happy Hearts have been our partners for years now in our GOL program. With their help, we are able to reach and help as many children with congenital heart disease (CHD) as we can.

So you see, this multiplier effect that is often talked about in business economics also works in helping others. People that received the Gift of Life is paying it forward by helping others that need help and introducing them to our club's GOL program.

Since this Rotary Year 2022 to 2023 started, we have already done 119 heart surgeries through the GOL program in partnership with the De Los Santos Medical Clinic and the National Children's Hospital and their heroic doctors.

On top of this, we have also given financial assistance to 928 patients within this six-month period through the Cong. Daza fund. Adding these numbers, we have a total of 1,047 kids saved!

There are many more kids to help. So, if possible, please donate to this cause because we need more funds to help these children. Your help will definitely go a long, long way!

### **Governor's Visit**

Today, I am glad that Gov. Mildred is giving us the traditional year-end visit. She is definitely a District leader I look up to.

Aside from the District's flagship programs like End-Polio, my governor also rolls out the Mildred V. Vitangcol or MVV Health Caravans every month, which we get the chance to help by donating a small amount of money every now and then.

Our club is just one of the 112 clubs in District 3830. Imagine what 10 Rotary Districts in the Philippines can do. Imagine the impact of thousands of PH Rotarians helping the communities.

### **GROWTH MINDSET**

Today I'd like to talk about the differences between growth and fixed mindsets.

Growth mindset, which is defined as the belief that talent is malleable and expandable with effort, practice and input from others; as opposed to innate and concrete, which is a fixed mindset.

Mindsets can be changed through learning, experience or intervention.

Mindsets represent foundational and orienting beliefs that define the goals, behaviours and reactions people exhibit in different situations.

Talking of goal orientations. People can have a learning goal orientation, concerned with increasing their competency and thus seeking opportunities to foster learning, or a performance goal orientation, concerned with gaining favourable judgements of their competence and a tendency to avoid situations that might expose them.

A growth mindset predicts valuing both learning and performance, while a fixed mindset predicts valuing performance over learning.

In terms of behaviours, a piece I was reading as part of my research stated the mindsets generate differences when tasks are difficult and challenging, rather than when tasks are easy or well known.



From a growth mindset perspective, effort is core to the process of learning; therefore, challenging tasks that require effort signal opportunities for development. Conversely, from a fixed mindset point of view, challenge and difficulty are negative signals of one's lack of ability and should be avoided.

Thinking about reactions, the impact of mindsets is most evident in the context of failure. When people who hold a growth mindset fail, they redouble their efforts, seek strategies to improve, and persist. When people who hold a fixed mindset fail, they withdraw effort, sometimes avoid information on how to improve, and disengage.

Having a growth mindset is critical in a fast-moving environment. When next you are interviewing for new recruits, select people who have a penchant for learning new skills, not those who are comfortable utilizing or adapting old ones.

Of course, research has found that mindsets shape goals, reactions and behaviours in organizational contexts. A recent study reported that the more an employee sees their firm endorsing a fixed versus growth mindset, the less they perceived their organisation to have a culture of collaboration, innovation and integrity, and the less they trusted and were committed to their company.

As discussed earlier, a growth mindset encourages learning and innovation through open communication, feedback and reactions to mistakes.

A fixed mindset seems to effect how people:

**Self-present** – they put energy into looking smart versus showing a willingness to learn.

**Allocate time and choose assignments** – they prefer situations that allow them to demonstrate their ability, at the risk of not learning new things versus situations that allow them to learn, at the risk of making mistakes.

**Hire and manage** – fixed mindset people look for innate talent, judge people as competent or incompetent at the start and focus on placing them in roles that best match current skills versus coach them to improve, learn from mistakes and place them in developmental assignments.

To counter this point, an example of a growth mindset company, Oberoi Hotels. When they hire new people, they of course hire for attitude and train for skill and importantly, look to a candidate's future, from the start. They only employ people who they believe, in time, can be promoted at least three levels above their starting position.

In closing, I encourage you always to approach your work with a growth mindset in mind. None of us have the time to dither with fixed mindset people.






