



COA: PHP565 billion gone in corruption

Kudos to the Commission on Audit (COA) for uncovering and penalizing nearly half a trillion pesos in state corruption and incompetence. Sen. Panfilo Lacson said this on Sunday even as he expressed disgust over the extent of corruption, which he said is "no small change."

"Thank you and congratulations to COA for diligently performing your mandate. It is disgusting that so much of the State fund is wasted on corruption and incompetence. PHP565.76B in Disallowances, Suspensions and Charges is by no means, small change," he said in a tweet.








PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

"The Single Most Important Skill In Leadership is Influence" - Tony Robbins

Working in IBM in the U.S., we were invariably in several cross-functional teams. I seldom saw groupthink as IBMers are generally driven people. I witnessed different types of behavior of team members to accomplish their objectives.

There were manipulators with very little regard for people's feelings, pushing them to do things people didn't want to do. Some got away with being manipulative but it does not generally work for IBMers.

Some of my colleagues were persuasive and would initially try to induce others to do something through argument or motivation. If that did not work, they would resort to negotiation.

I was impressed with those with a higher-level skill than persuasion and negotiation. In cross function teams, these members with no direct authority were able to affect another without directly forcing it to happen.

The coolest thing is there was no apparent effort that got others to volunteer for assignments. They somehow made their desired action the other person's idea. This to me is influence.

In persuasion or negotiation, we could later on change our mind. But when we're influenced, there is less chance we would change our mind because we've made the choice of the path we took.

I was awed by the influential IBMers' ability to read people, tune into their feelings, act by knowing in real-time what, when, how to say it and build bonds with others.

When I have been in a similar situation with someone, I find being empathetic towards others helps create a positive connection. My kids always tell me get in touch with people's feelings by paying attention to body language and facial expressions.

When I lived in New York, I had occasions to meet several times with Dr. Frank Ashby, author of the bestseller book "Embracing Excellence" during the time he invited me to be in the advisory board of his company, Leadership Capital Group LLC.

I asked Dr. Ashby to share with me how he has been able to continue for decades, his consulting practice with Fortune 500 companies.

His answer was surprisingly simple. He said he was always working on building trust with his clients by staying humble. He told me that the best thing I could have was to show an attitude that I have no special importance that makes me better than others.

Dr. Ashby's advice to me was I should always recognize my flaws so I would never stop trying to improve myself. He said it is easy to become arrogant by looking at myself as higher and better than others.

He said humble people always "let the other person save face" by doing or saying things (or not saying things) in order to avoid or lessen them being embarrassed or to make one's self look better.

He said it is easy to become arrogant by looking at myself as higher and better than others" I can relate to Dr. Ashby when I do a job performance appraisal. The mood is more amiable when I start an appraisal with honest appreciation: stating the good points of the person. When I draw attention to areas we are in agreement, it encourages the person to take criticism in a more constructive way than they would otherwise.

Being warm, friendly, showing empathy, humble, letting the other person save face are examples of influence practices. Influence is critical to both our professional and personal lives. For parents, influence skills help us claim authority over our children without losing their friendship.

There is one caveat though. Consistent insincere application of influence practices to accomplish an agenda or just to get something from someone will likely boomerang and ruin one's credibility.

In conclusion, in the words of Dr. Ashby, "... treating others with respect and sensitivity can be a great motivational influence on their behavior and attitudes. It can also be a great confidence-building factor for ourselves, when we realize we are developing the ability to deal with others with mutually beneficial results..."


Even during covid, when the hospitals were full, our resources and connections would somehow enable us to manage to get a room when so many other desperate people could not.




