### PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

#### Men of Action!

Most of you know that football (the sport you play with your feet, not that American head-bashing fest) is one of my passions. I'm like most Scots in that sense. Football is in our soul. As a young boy, Scotland had some great players and we almost always qualified for major tournaments like the World Cup. The sight of the Tartan Army at a football tournament is truly something to behold: a sea of plaid, a cacophony of singing and bagpipes, plenty of laughter and a determination to make friends. It has long been something I have wanted to share directly with my kids.

Unfortunately, since my eldest son was born, Scotland has failed to qualify for any tournament finals. I always joke with him that he has been a jinx! So this last week, when we beat Serbia in a nail-biting play-off to qualify for the European Championship Finals, the whole nation and the entire Thomson household was on Cloud 9.

The following day, I awoke to the devastating floods across our country as a result of Typhoon Ulysses. And the day after that I rose to beautify blue skies and flat seas.

I've always struggled to some extent with the flat-palmed, in-your-face, what-you-going-to-do-about-it contrasts of living in the Philippines. The abject poverty right outside the gates of Forbes Park or Ayala Alabang; the cardboard shacks and mange-ridden dogs on the approach to Punta Fuego; the beautiful sunset boat ride when thousands are stranded on their roof-tops; the elation of a football victory when hundreds have died..

It strikes me that there are different ways of dealing with those juxtapositions. One way is simply to learn to turn a blind eye, to focus on your own life and circumstances and find peace in your ignorance. At the other extreme, you can devote yourself to helping on the front line, leaving behind your soft comforts to share in the hardship and make things better from the bottom up, in the way that Roy Moore has done in Payatas with Fairplay For all.

Unfortunately, 99% of us lack Roy's courage and conviction. Fortunately most of us are unable to turn a blind eye.

Critically, for those of us in Rotary, we have an infrastructure through which we can directly assist whilst only stepping as far out of our comfort zone as we feel capable of doing. In our projects, we can be as hands on as we like. We can devote our time and our talent directly, or we can provide funding so others can do so on our behalf. And of course we can do both. But we NEED to do one or the other or else we are no form of Rotarian.

And the more we do so, the harder it is for those around us in equal privilege to turn a blind eye.

What did YOU do yesterday to balance the scales? It is a question I ask myself every morning. I hope you do too

## **SCOTCH CORNER**

Today's word is: SKOOSH, v., n., adv. Also sc(h)oosh. [skuf]

Skoosh is an onomatopoeic word that has come to have many different meanings. Although it may be considerably older, written evidence for skoosh first appears in the late nineteenth century.


Skoosh ably describes the smooth movement of an object, sliding around in liquid-like flow. So your bag of chips (accompaniment to fish) might be "skooshed" down the counter towards you. In days of old, the word became associated with the sound made by tramcars skiting along at speed, with the result that they were known as "skoosh-cars".

In Glasgow at least, it also means a drink, and most notably soda (almost certainly Irn Bru), I suspect because if you squished a plastic bottle it would "skoosh" out of the top. But I certainly remember buying a bottle of "skoosh" at the local shops.

Finally, it also means "easy", or something non-problematic. "How was the long 16th on the back nine?" "Ach, I birdied it again. It's a total skoosh"

## Scottish Heritage Loch Lomond At 71 square kilometres in surface area, Loch (the "ch" sounds like you are clearing your throat) Lomond is the largest freshwater lake in the UK and is a "must see" destination for anyone visiting Scotland. The famous eponymously titled song tells the story of two Scots imprisoned in England, one of whom is sentenced to die, but who poetically reflects to his companion: "O ye'll take the high road and I'll take the low road\* And I'll be in Scotland afore ye But me and my true love will never meet again On the bonnie, bonnie banks of Loch Lomond" Being just 14 miles outside of Glasgow, Loch Lomond sits in a fabulous National Park and offers all sorts of water sports, fishing, camping and climbing activities, and has few decent restaurants. There is also what we in Scotland consider to be a spectacularly exclusive and expensive private golf course, where I once saw a speedboat sitting in a bunker; the result of too much afternoon wine and not enough caution with the throttle. The island in the picture, complete with its own population of wallabies, was recently sold for just over \$700k. \*Membership is \$75k! Manila Golfers eat your heart out!!!

### **ABOUT THE GUEST SPEAKER**



MR. MATTHEW WESTFALL COO & Head Distiller, Full Circle Craft Distillers

Matthew Westfall co-founded Full Circle Craft Distillers Co., a passion project that aims to place the Philippines on the global craft spirits map. As Head Distiller and Chief Operating Officer, Matthew heads the team behind Full Circle's award-winning line of artisanal Archipelago spirits, which have quickly emerged as the top craft spirits brand in the Philippines and can now be found in selected markets in Asia, Europe and the US.

Matthew Westfall is an urban planner, documentary filmmaker and writer with over 30 years of experience in the field of international development. Matthew has broad-based expertise in urban infrastructure project operations, economic and sector work, public-private partnerships, regional cooperation, and external relations and communications. He has led multidisciplinary teams on large investment projects, complex training and capacity building programs for local governments and communities, and strategy formulation and policy dialogue with donors and clients.

As an urban sector expert, Matthew provided leadership and strategic management for operations in the Central and West Asia Region (Pakistan, Afghanistan, Central Asia and the South Caucasus) and developed a robust loan pipeline. He established and managed ADB's Azerbaijan Resident Mission in Baku, where he led lending and technical assistance programs that targeted municipal development, transport, urban water supply and sanitation, renewable energy, and education. As regional director based in Frankfurt, Germany, Matthew oversaw operations in 10 Central and West Asia countries. He also served as ADB's country director in Kazakhstan where he led project operations, private sector development and external relations and outreach.

Matthew is an award-winning writer, producer and director of film and video productions that tackle the issues of poverty, megacities, gender disparities, education and the environment. His documentary productions, garnering an array of festival awards, have been broadcast worldwide, narrated by such celebrities as Malcolm McDowell, Willem Dafoe, and F. Murray Abraham. On Borrowed Land, executive produced by Oliver Stone, premiered at the Hawaii International Film Festival, leading to policy changes that have helped address urban poverty in the Philippines. His public service announcements, featuring the music of Enya, have aired globally on CNN and Bloomberg.

In his spare time, Matthew enjoys writing and exploring history. His first work of narrative nonfiction, The Devil's Causeway, a story about the early American military experience in the Philippines, was published by Lyons Press in September 2012, garnering a coveted starred review from Publisher's Weekly. The paperback edition of The Devil's Causeway was released in March 2020.


