PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE



FRANCO DEL ROSARIO President, RY 2021 - 2022

First, let me thank everyone who worked very hard for this induction. Thank you to Rtn. Lars Wittig for making this room available for our live stream-zoom induction. – Thank you to the Induction Committee, the people who helped make all this possible.

In the past few weeks, board members and Club advisers were energetically engaged in a number of *Club Refresh* sessions, conducted by Craig Lonnee, Chief Development Officer of the DDB Group. In our discussions, we went back to basics: questioning embedded beliefs, reminding ourselves what we're all here to do – and figuring out how to keep our club relevant and "future proof."

We worked on re-calibrating the Club's vision and culture and discussed near term strategies. We went back and redefined what we stand for, in these changed times, and we arrived at a refreshed purpose. We even went back to the Makati West hymn, which we sang earlier, and asked ourselves how true have we really been to verses like: "Helping communities the way we know best", and "Social upliftment is our fulfillment."

There are three things that we decided to focus on:

Sustainability, Efficiency and Accountability: S-E-A

On **Sustainability**, we got a reality check and agreed that "What got us HERE, will not get us THERE". With this in mind, we were encouraged to reboot, revitalize our Club's vision and define where "THERE" actually is; and how we might get there.

On **Efficiency**, we did a deep dive into how we can increase our *capacity to serve*, which is the theme of Makati West this Rotary Year.

We identified three levers to increase our *capacity to serve*. **One**, is to unleash the untapped talent across our Club. **Two**, to grow our membership this year and **three**, to streamline our Club's processes. We'll get back to this later.

On **Accountability**. A great part of our Club's unique culture is our members' capacity and willingness to seamlessly transition between leader and follower roles. In Makati West, *followers* display the courage to assume responsibility and serve while the leaders hold themselves accountable by being accessible, credible, supportive and dependable at all times.



PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

We did some reflection. Our club has a good story to tell the world around us. We have had many sustainable life -changing projects. We have the Gift of Life, the Gift of Mobility, the Gift of Sight. among others. What did we do right to be blessed with these amazing opportunities to help others?

I believe that it is largely attributable to the fact that the members of RCMW consider service as a calling. This is one of the strengths of our positive culture, which truly has been the foundation of our club's consistent success. So, we asked ourselves - what in our culture do we need to continue to work on - to exercise and nurture more?

Together we identified a few, and I will take these to be my three focus areas this year.

I will call them my 3 R's:

The **first "R"**, is to **recognize** more often, our members' participation and cooperation and to always show appreciation for their service and interest in our projects. This includes showing appreciation to our community partners and to our unwaveringly committed, passionate staff, as well.

Let us all have our antennas up so we immediately recognize the achievements and milestones of our members and their families, such as a new child or grandchild, wedding of their children; and be on the lookout for acts of kindness and selflessness within the club and its projects or even outside in their homes and communities. The same goes for being sensitive to when our members' and their families may be going through difficult times, be they personal, emotional, or health related.

The **second R** is to **retain** members. I have a confession to make, I need to practice active listening when people are speaking and to include listening even more attentively- to what is not being said. I believe that if I do a better job in listening, it will give me important information to provide more value to our Club membership. Please do share with me feedback from our members; as this is what ultimately dictates and drives success in higher retention rates, a strong network for referrals, accolades, as well as advocates.

Through our weekly meetings and fireside chats; through our project visits and on boarding sessions for members and classification talks – let us get to know more about each other's interests and where we are called to serve.

Let us be more intentional in the way we engage members. Let us not deny any member the satisfaction and fulfillment in serving. We have members that by simply igniting their passion to serve, will be happy to say - I'm all in. My goal is by the end of September for everyone to be energetically and actively involved in at least a couple of projects and committees.

The **third R** is to **recruit**. Let us not forget that it is every member's responsibility to be a Makati West advocate. Let's be more pro-active, persistent and relentless in recommending our club to friends, peers and acquaintances. We can welcome guests more actively: engage them in discussions on where their interests lie and how our club can best serve them as well.

Actually, let's strive to go further – and challenge ourselves to consistently 'live' the Makati West purpose and values- so that when we do engage with others, they will "want" to be "who we are" and want to "have" what we value. Moving forward, this is indeed a very meaningful way to recruit and retain our members.

The future, as always, belongs to those who are ready to put others first and SERVE - and that is US! Makati West, Men of Zest onward and upward!



GOV. MARIA JOCELYN GENEVIEVE "JOJI" TAN District Governor 3830, RY 2021-2022

Our Governor, Maria Jocelyn Genevieve L. Tan, is the epitome of a true Rotarian.

For 26 years, she has been a member of the Rotary Club of Makati Dasmariñas – one of the largest Rotary Clubs in the district with over 90 members.

She became President of our Club during the Centenary of the Rotary movement in 2004. As President, she initiated and propelled so many service projects.

However, the program closest to her heart is RCMD's Alay Sa Kalusugan, a maternal and child health program which undertakes feeding modules and training for severely malnourished children and their mothers. This program, which continues to this day, has spun off into programs for Bahay Pag-Asa, Bahay Aruga (a center in Pasig for Youth in Conflict with the Law and children at risk) which has been awarded by the City of Pasig.

Because of her work as President, the District awarded her the Centennial Medal of Honor as the Most Outstanding Club President Over-All for RY 2004-2005.

Our incoming Governor has fulfilled numerous district leadership roles. She served as Senior Assistant Governor, Assistant Governor, District Committee Chair for key committees including District Conference Chair twice in a row, Trustee of the Rotary Homes Foundation, and as Rotary Academy Executive Director.

In 2007, she received a Most Outstanding International Service Award for ably representing Philippine Rotary in District 5170, California. She received a personal commendation from Past R.I. President Mat Caparas for her two-week road-show in the Bay Area. She was awarded by Rotary International President Ray Klinginsmith in 2010 with the "Avenues of Service Citation for Individual Rotarians" for outstanding efforts in each of the avenues of service.

Our incoming Governor's classification is Orthodontics and Oral Wellness. A graduate of the University of the Philippines College of Dentistry, she was a member of the UP Faculty for 13 years, both in the undergraduate and graduate levels.

She is likewise the President & CEO of Smile Pilipinas Development Foundation, an NGO working with partners such as Oral-B, Proctor and Gamble, UP, DOH, and various LGUs, whose advocacy is to help address the dire state of oral public health in our country.

Through Smile Pilipinas, she and her Club, in partnership with various other clubs in the District, have built 10 wash-and-brush stations in various public schools in the Greater Manila Area.

Our incoming Governor shares a happy home and family life with Conrad Banal – a respected Business Journalist who is the incumbent President of our club, The Rotary Club of Makati Dasmariñas.

Both the incoming Governor and President Conrad are Major Donors to The Rotary Foundation and members of the Paul Harris Society in their own respective right.

Her Vision for next Rotary Year is to make it a milestone life-changing year, with renewed commitment for the new decade ahead. She invites incoming club leaders and every Rotarian in District 3830 to come together as a united community that takes action for humanity.
