

GUEST SPEAKER DR. ABIGAIL RIVERA TUD

Consultant, Philippine Orthopedic Center

Dr. Abigail Tud, MD, is an orthopedic oncologist consultant at the Musculoskeletal Tumor Unit of the Philippine Orthopedic Center, where she was recognized as Employee of the Year in 2021. She is concurrently a clinical and research fellow at the Therapeutical and Research Center for Musculoskeletal Tumors at the Taipei Veterans General Hospital in Taiwan.

She was also a clinical and research fellow in Orthopedic Oncology at the Philippine Orthopedic Center for one and a half years until June 2020. She took up her Residency Training in Orthopedic Surgery at the Department of Orthopedics of The Medical City in Pasig, where she was awarded as Most Outstanding Trainee.

She graduated from a double degree program in Medicine and Master of Business Administration at the Ateneo School of Medicine and Public Health on full scholarship.

Her recent publications include: "Functional Outcome of Displaced Intra-Articular Fractures of the Distal Radius" and "A Comparison of Complication rates between early and delayed surgery among patients with fragility fractures of the hip".





PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

Economic Outlook

For businessmen like most of us, the country's economic growth rate is an important piece of information as it serves as an indicator of the business environment that we will be dealing with for the rest of the year.

Online news sites have it that Finance Secretary Benjamin Diokno has reported that government is forecasting 6.5% GDP growth rate for this year, which is a bit lower than 2022's full-year target due to the expected slowdown of the global economy.

Nonetheless, he said that we can expect the country to remain resilient amidst a looming global recession given our stable banking system, our vibrant local manufacturing sector, and record-low unemployment. Secretary Diokno also said that at the backbone of the country's growth is the public-private partnership that will further expand the Build, Better, More infrastructure agenda of the Marcos administration.

With our Past President TG Limcaoco leading one of the country's largest banks, I truly believe in the stability of the banking system. We heard it straight from him last week during his talk



that BPI is even growing larger and stronger this year. I would love to say that "we are in good hands" with PP TG leading BPI, but I just remembered that that's the tagline of another universal bank.

And speaking of unemployment, the country's jobless rate significantly decreased to 5.2% in July 2022 from 7.2% in the same period the prior year according to the Philippine Statistics Authority (PSA). This is the lowest unemployment rate since the onset of the COVID-19 pandemic, and the lowest recorded by PSA's Labor Force Survey since 2005.

I saw this in our businesses, and my partners, Rtn. Judd Balayan and Rtn. Jeff Dytuco, can attest that our FOSA Group, a DDB Group affiliate that is in the services sector, is definitely back and even busier than it was before the pandemic. Through FOSA, we have now given employment to over 5,000 Filipinos nationwide, uplifting them and their families from poverty, and enabling them to dream once again for their children's future.

With all these, I believe that 2023 will really be a good year for all of us.

Still on the country's economy, Sec. Diokno mentioned the planned launch of the Maharlika

Investment Fund, the country's first sovereign wealth fund, to diversify the country's financial portfolio and support the goals set by the administration in the Philippine Development Plan for 2023 to 2028.

With the proposed Maharlika Investment Fund making investments in the basic areas of agriculture, energy, digitalization and climate change, President Bongbong Marcos said that he hopes that "the wealth fund will be a mechanism to increase the country's economic stability and alleviate poverty".

A lot is being said about the Maharlika Fund, so I asked our dear member, Congressman Paul Daza to talk about it in our February 2 Weekly Lunch Meeting. Thanks Cong. Paul for accepting this invitation to do the talk.

After Cong. Daza, we will have the Australian Ambassador to the Philippines, Her Excellency Hae Kyong Yu, talk before us on February 9. I would love to hear from her about updates on PH's bilateral trade and relations with Australia. As you know, foreign trade and investments are important fuels to the nation's economy.

We also have Clark Development Corporation President Agnes Devanadera lined up as speaker on February 23. Her track record in the Energy Regulatory Commission makes me excited to know her vision and plans for the Clark Freeport.

So that's our February speakers. February 16 is reserved for our Valentine's fellowship party. I look forward to seeing you all.

Project Updates

As I mentioned during the Governor's visit last December 20, we have a new Global Grant for our Artificial Limbs Project, which targets to benefit 85 indigent persons with disability.





Our social workers, Cynthia and Mike, are already doing the initial screening for this, and 33 beneficiaries will be scheduled for a final screening by Dr. Josephine Bundoc of the Philippine General Hospital.

For the benefit of our new members, let me give a short background on this project. The Rotary Club of Makati West started the Artificial Limbs Project in 2004 in partnership with the Rotary Club of Coimbatore-Midtown, India.

The project aims to help individuals who have lost their legs (both above and below the knee) due to military service and accidents in line of duty, civilians who met accidents, people who have suffered from severe diabetes, as well as those born with this condition. People who suffer from severe diabetes or those who met accidents or have birth disorders make up most of the amputee patients. Mostly indigent, these amputees could not afford to buy artificial limbs.

Fortunately, the club's arrangements with hospitals enable us to have more amputees undergo operation at much less costs. These have brought down the costs of operations from hundreds of thousands of pesos to just about Php17,000 per limb for below-the-knee and Php30,000 per limb for above-the-knee amputee patients.

Our club was able to bring the miracle of hope, mobility, freedom, dignity, independence, and change in the lives of the less fortunate members of society through this project.

So if you want to be of any help and participate in this project, please reach out to our Artificial Limbs Project Chair Robbie Leviste and Co-Chair Alex Floro, and/or our secretariat.

Please continue to support our other projects as well.

Meanwhile, for our last speaker in January, we have Dr. Abigail Tud, Consultant on Orthopedic Oncology at the Philippine Orthopedic Center. Our Rotary Anns reached out to her last December to prepare a Christmas gift-giving party for young bone-cancer patients at the Philippine Orthopedic Center. It's Ladies' Day so I hope our Rotary Anns get to learn a lot from our speaker while enjoying their time together.

I have to apologize for not being with you in today's weekly meeting. Our ever-reliable President-Elect Dax Carlos will be taking over as acting president for today. I am currently in Coron, Palawan to attend the planning for the upcoming District Conference. Our club will be in charge of this district event's Communications.




