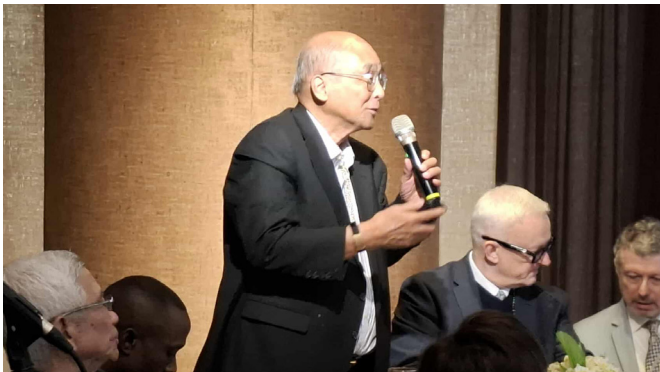

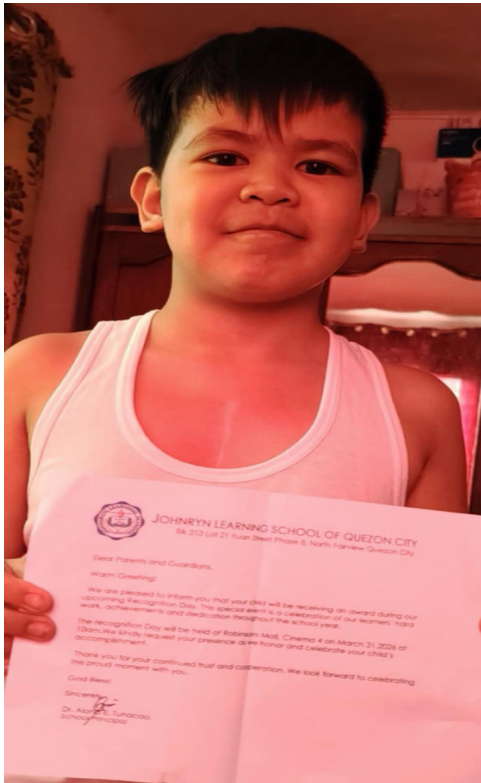

Payatas FOOTBALL CLUB

Payatas Football Club was founded in 2011 by British national Roy Moore, and is the flagship program of the Fairplay For All Foundation Inc.

What began as a modest effort training 80 children once a week on a barangay basketball court has grown into a thriving community program. Today, Payatas FC boasts more than 250 registered players (about 30% are girls) and its very own sports facility, the Payatas Sports Center.



To coach 250+ players training 2-3x per week at our sports center, we have trained our older players from the community to become Youth Coaches while also earning an allowance. This provides them with a more empowering alternative to scavenging in the local garbage industry, allowing them to earn and support their education in a meaningful way. To equip them for this role, we offer our very own Fairplay Coaching Course Levels 1-3, which provides the necessary skills and training to excel as youth coaches.

A safe space for kids to play, learn the sport, and grow.





Our PROJECT

Executive Summary: Rotary Foundation of Makati West Inc. Donations

Duration: **Feb 2025-Jan 2026**
Approved Budget: **PHP 265,276.00**



The project, which received a financial donation from Rotary Foundation of Makati West Inc., was designed to support the grassroots program of Payatas Football Club. The donation primarily covers participation in various leagues and tournaments, meals for the players, and a significant portion allocated for coaches' salaries. This support aims to strengthen coach development, mentoring, and the facilitation of coaching courses from February 2025 to January 2026.

Payatas FC has been a mainstay in local sporting events, particularly in futsal and football. Participation in these competitions not only sharpens the technical skills of our players on the pitch but also nurtures essential values such as fair play, teamwork, and sportsmanship—qualities that extend beyond sports and into their everyday lives.

With the financial support, Payatas FC successfully participated in the NCRFA Youth League/Domestic Youth League, and other leagues and tournaments following competitions, which included meals and transportation for all players.

These tournaments and leagues are beneficial to the development of Payatas FC players and to help them gain experience in competitive leagues.





Project Objectives

Develop Technical Skills: Provide consistent exposure to competitive futsal and football to enhance technical and tactical abilities.

Instill Core Values: Promote discipline, teamwork, leadership, and sportsmanship.

Expand Opportunities: Create pathways for players to access scholarships and higher-level competitions.

Promote Grassroots Development: Ensure children from underserved communities have access to quality sports programs.

Encourage Healthy Lifestyles: Inspire active and healthy habits through regular sports participation.

This project empowers Payatas FC players not only to excel in football and futsal but also to develop essential life skills that will help them build better futures for themselves and their families.

NCRFA/DOMESTIC YOUTH LEAGUE



Payatas FC participated in the NCRFA Competition of the Philippine Football Federation (PFF) in the U10, U12, and U14 girls categories, held from February to December 2025.

This competition proved to be both an exhilarating and challenging experience for Payatas FC. Our players showed significant improvement throughout the season. The U12 team earned a First Runner-Up award, and the U14 girls also finished as 2nd Runner-Up. The children experienced immense joy and had something to look forward to every weekend.

The competition was especially meaningful for the kids, as for many of them it was their first time to join a competitive league. For some, it was also their first time traveling outside Payatas and seeing tall buildings and more affluent neighborhoods. Overall, the experience was joyful, eye-opening, and inspiring for the players.





Fairplay Summer Fair



Every year, we celebrate the anniversary of Payatas Football Club by organizing a Summer Fair to recognize our achievements and honor our players and coaches for their hard work and improvement throughout the year. The children and their families come together to celebrate with joy and excitement, enjoying a variety of games, an ukay-ukay, and kit giveaways for our players.

The Donations from Rotary Foundation of Makati West Inc. helps provide food during the event for our Payatas FC players. Because of this support, they are able to fully enjoy the celebration without worrying about being hungry.





Fairplay Coaching Courses



When Payatas Football Club first started, one of our biggest challenges was the lack of a dedicated facility. We relied on the local barangay court, but our training sessions were often rescheduled or canceled to give way to adult basketball and volleyball games. Because of the limited availability of the court, our players did not always have consistent access to training. Even then, we already dreamed of having a space of our own.

Years later, that dream became a reality when we finally had our own court. With a permanent and safe space to train, the number of children joining our program increased significantly. However, this growth also brought a new challenge: who would coach them?

This is how our community-based coaching course was born, aligned with the mission and vision of Fairplay For All Foundation. We created our own coaching development program to train coaches from within the community. The course focuses on forming coaches who deeply understand our values and who embody our core principles of Fairplay.

While 2 of our coaches hold official coaching licenses—which are excellent for developing technical skills and tactical knowledge in sports—our approach goes beyond competition and strategy. In Fairplay, we emphasize FUN, CARE, and IMPROVEMENT. Our goal is not only to win tournaments but to nurture caring, responsible adults who serve as positive role models for our children. We develop coaches who prioritize the holistic growth of every player, ensuring that each child feels supported, valued, and encouraged.

This initiative and support provided by the Rotary Foundation of Makati West also creates meaningful opportunities for our older players. Instead of spending 8–12 hours scavenging to earn income, they can serve as community coaches and earn a similar amount in a more sustainable and dignified way. At the same time, they gain leadership skills, structured learning opportunities, and the flexibility to focus on their education. Through this holistic pathway, we are not only developing athletes—we are building futures.

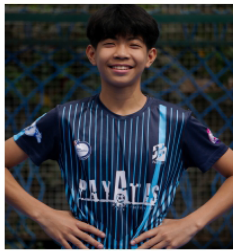

Payatas FC Coaches 2026



At start of 2026, We now have 12 Level 2 coaches who leads training sessions and 7 Level 1 coaches. Our Level 2 coaches lead the day-to-day training sessions at the Payatas Sports Center. Meanwhile, our Level 1 coaches primarily learn from the Level 2 coaches and assist them during training sessions, gaining hands-on experience and understanding the proper structure of our program and then eventually apply for level 2 coaching courses.



Coaching Development & Community Impact



Through years of consistent support, In 2025, Six more players earned a scholarships at reputable colleges, including PUP and UMAK. With the growing number of children playing on our courts, we anticipate even more young athletes achieving varsity scholarships, opening greater opportunities for their future.

These achievements have become a powerful source of inspiration within the community. Many young players now dream of becoming varsity athletes and even representing the country, motivated by the success of their older peers competing at universities and on the national team.

Others have discovered a passion for coaching, inspired by the dedication of the youth coaches who mentor them daily. At the same time, parents and families have gained greater confidence in the program, recognizing its positive impact in supporting underprivileged children through both sports and education.

4. **Enhance Infrastructure and Sustainability** – Upgrade facilities and establish sustainable funding sources to support long-term program operations.
5. **Launch New Sports Programs** – Broaden participation by offering additional sports such as basketball, volleyball, and badminton. These programs help develop overall athleticism while providing children with positive alternatives that protect them from harm, vices, and negative environments.

In a community where child labor remains prevalent, providing a safe and nurturing environment for children is essential. This foundation enables our education and social support programs to thrive.

As we move into 2026, we look forward to expanding our reach, supporting more scholars, improving infrastructure, and building a stronger, more sustainable future for Payatas FC.
