GUEST SPEAKER MR. EMILIO "JUN" S. NERI LEAD ECONOMIST

Prior to his appointment as Lead Economist at Bank of the Philippine Islands, our speaker served as economics and banking sector analyst for a former Bangko Sentral ng Pilipinas - Monetary Board Member.

He was a consultant at the Asian Development Bank; was senior Economics researcher and lecturer on monetary and fiscal policy at the University of Asia and the Pacific.

The Research Team led by our speaker consistently ranks at the top of survey for analysts conducted by Bloomberg, Asiamoney and The Asset. In 2019, he was awarded number 1 Best Equities Economist, and number 2 Best Fixed Income Economist by the Fund Managers Association of the Philippines. More recently, he was ranked #1 Best Local Currency Bond Individual for Research in the Asset Benchmark Research Awards 2021.

Our speaker was also ranked #1 among local economists by the Department of Finance as having the most accurate gross domestic product (GDP) growth projections from 2016 to 2018, and was the former President of the Philippine Economic Society in 2020.

Joji was lavish with her praise, gave our club a fine reputation to live up to, appealed to our nobler motives and posed a challenge to our club.

common fisherman from Zamboanga, the lone Filipino recipient of the 2021 Ramon Magsaysay service. Ballon started a movement among the fisherfolk to save fishing in his home town of Kabalasan, by replanting and reviving mangrove forests in a coastal area of about 500 hectares.

Ballon turned Kabalasan around, from a struggling fisherfolk village to one that could provide opportunities to improve their lives with increased earnings. Today they are able to buy boat engines as well as send their kids to school.

That is the same idea behind our recovery project for the little known Dinagat Island province that

was pummeled to the ground by Typhoon Odette. This is a joint project with the Rotary Club of Kowloon, with a US\$ 10K pledge, HARPDI, District 3860 and local Rotary Clubs in Surigao; as there is no Rotary presence in Dinagat Island.

Other than just raising funds for about ten registered motorized fishing boats equipped with essential items like fishing nets, life jackets, and repair tools for the fisherfolk of San Jose, a key objective of this project is to assist this municipality to become a thriving community. This means the interconnectedness of humans and ecosystems is key for them to become a sustainable and regenerative community.

The recycle and renew strategies of this project entail mobilizing the San Jose community for livelihood and work towards making the area a tourist attraction. In keeping with Gov. Joji's recommendation, our Dinagat project includes partnering with non-Rotary groups and organizing a Rotary Community Corps in order to properly assess how we can support them.

The meetings with San Jose community representatives will deal with the creation of new income opportunities like home cultivation of mung bean sprouts, as well as new productive jobs with the womenfolk, turning typhoon debris into flower pots.

In order to change people, Gov. Joji appeals to our nobler motives. "I tell you the story of Mr. Ballon because that is actually my big ask from the club – a highly impactful environmental project. If there is a club in the district that can lead us in such a project, it is this club and no other".

The co-chairs for this project are Robbie Leviste and Alex Floro. I encourage you to volunteer.

Gov. Joji reminded us: "You all know our battle cry this year: Each one, bring one.Let it be on top of our club agenda for the rest of the year. To be sure, this will not happen unless and until the leadership of each club pays close attention to it..."

"With 107 members at the start of the Rotary year, a 15% growth in membership will merit a 5-Star Club award. I am sure that this club can achieve this goal". Currently, we are 110 members, having recruited 5 members to-date and lost 2 (PDG Tony and Rob Bradshaw). To keep our 5 star status which we have held for six years, we need to end this rotary year at 123. This means we need to recruit 13 more members while not losing any.

Though Gov. Joji's challenge is a tall order, there is still time. Men of zest, we have a shot at accomplishing this challenge if each cluster bring one new member and most of all if we execute our winning 3R's: Recognize, Retain and Recruit.

In closing, please let give you all an assignment. Check our club's weekly meeting attendance (click here) and pick a half dozen members that have not been so active. Please give them a phone call or better still, (once it's safe), invite them to lunch or drinks, ok?

Next Thursday, we have the opportunity to hear Her Excellency, Michele Boccoz, French Ambassador to the Philippines as she gives us a better understanding of the actions undertaken by the French Embassy in the Philippines during this pandemic, as well as updates on our bilateral relationship.

1. Contribute \$26.50 per capita in annual fund giving

2. Contribute a minimum of US \$400 per club to the Polio Plus Fund for Large Club]





Target (Optional)

1. Have at least 1 member become a Paul Harris Fellow with a minimum donation of \$500 (for every 3PHFs, an additional criteria point shall be earned)






