



PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

Back to Basics: Soft Skills

"Authenticity is the unimpeded operation of one's true or core self in daily enterprise and stands in contrast to the "fake it until you make it" philosophy."

Michel Kernis. Researcher.

Did you know soft skills most directly affect our bottom line? Why?

Perhaps a brief review at what soft skills are about will answer the question.

Simply put: Soft skills are a combination of people skills, communication skills, character attributes, attitudes that enable employees to navigate their environment, work well with others, achieve their goals with complementing hard skills.

Many of my own beliefs on soft skills, I learned from Dr. Frank Ashby, CEO of The Leadership Capital Group (LCC) in New York during the times I attended LCC board meetings. His book, "Developing Effective Leadership Programs" and the best seller, "Embracing Excellence" are regarded as outstanding guides on leadership development programs.

Based on Frank's numerous years consulting for Fortune 500 companies, he says soft skills are what matter most to clients and employees. The lack of soft skills impact a business as a whole and could be the cause of problems in productivity, innovation, and growth.

Ironically, soft skills are often overlooked in hiring and training. Companies tend to over focus on hard skills and the technical mastery of their businesses while forgetting that soft skills will boost technical people's

capability of thinking and acting beyond their functional expertise, and even help them understand the business from multiple perspectives.

Soft skills help leverage the technical knowledge of employees by marrying technical skills with the soft skills critical in fostering meaningful relationships. This results in a "esprit de corps" and is invaluable in navigating setbacks.

In my Oct. 14th WSS piece, I wrote on, "Culture Eats Strategy For Breakfast". I made reference to Rob Coffee, author of The Character of a Corporation, where he describes the four types of cultures - Networked: high sociability and low solidarity; Driven: high solidarity, low sociability; Compartmentalized: low on both solidarity and sociability and Communal: high on both.

While the pandemic may have shifted company cultures to that of the cost effective "Compartmentalized" culture, it may have possibly produced higher levels of productivity and employee retention. Likewise, it has created new WFH opportunities, such as business owners and executives are forgoing renting office space and realizing savings in overhead (computers, phones, electricity, maintenance).

Our club's lack of in-person fellowship due to the pandemic has not taken away from our "networked" culture. I'd even argue that this aspect of our club has been enhanced, because we have been forced to work harder at it.

I believe the pandemic has enriched the social skills of our members, I see they are reaching out further and making an even greater difference in the communities we serve and to each other. I am confident that we will be coming away from this pandemic with a greater zeal, ready to impact every aspect of our personal lives and in our business relationships.

For me, the top social skill is the communal, aka interpersonal skill. I have witnessed in my 15 years with IBM North America, the executives and colleagues with interpersonal skills easily build bonds; as they show real interest in others. Another observation is these IBMers are able to tune into their feelings and are adept at reading, understanding, and empathizing while acting in real-time and knowing what to say and when and how to say it.

Gov. Joji was lavish in her praise with our club during her Governor's visit. It was apt for her to do that as it was a sincere compliment; citing specific evidence and reasons for her praise. Interpersonal communication is ineffective when it is not honest. It is effective when it comes from genuine people that live true to themselves.

RCMW's recovery project for the San Jose municipality for the little known Dinagat Island province that was pummeled to the ground by Typhoon Odette. This is a joint project with the Rotary Club of Kowloon, with a US\$ 10K pledge, HARPDI, District 3860 and local Rotary Clubs.

Other than just raising funds for about ten registered motorized fishing boats equipped with essentials like fishing nets, life jackets and repair tools are the "recycle and renew" strategies of this project that calls for the creation of new income opportunities like home cultivation of mung bean sprouts with the womenfolk, turning typhoon debris into flower pots.

Our Dinagat project includes partnering with non-Rotary groups and organizing a Rotary Community Corps that will deal with other livelihood initiatives and working towards making the area a tourist attraction.




