#### Men of Action!

Like most people I've tried reading Stephen Hawking's "Brief History of Time" in an attempt to understand the workings of the Universe a bit better, but also like most people I got stuck after a couple of chapters, fascinating though they were. I suppose one key take-away was a very rudimentary understanding of Einstein's Theory of Relativity which proposes that energy cannot be created or destroyed, merely transferred.


