As Junior Achievement (JA) Philippines Executive Director, Krishna Alejandrino has been inspiring the youth to value entrepreneurship for 11 years now, leading the organization's overall operations, including training and development, business planning, and marketing of the organization in the Philippines and abroad. JA Philippines is part of JA Worldwide, one of the top 7 non-government organizations around the world.

He has been awarded by the Philippine Marketing Association, the Financial Executives of the Philippines, and the Philippine Constructors Association as "Marketing Adviser of the Year" from 2006 to 2008. In 2009, he was awarded as the "Most Outstanding Faculty Member" by Southville International School and Colleges. He was also named Associate Fellow Business Educator by the Philippine Council of Deans and Educators in Business and the Philippine Academy of Professionals in Business Education

In 2013 he received the "Youth Development Award" from the Chartered Association of Business Administrators for establishing programs for young students. He also received the 2018 Service Excellence Award from the International Christian Academy, the 2018 Excellence Award from the Saint Joseph College, and the 2023 Presidential Excellence Recognition Award from the Philippine Councils of Deans and Business Educators.

He holds a Master's Degree in Marketing Research from the University of Santo Tomas.

Although, you may say, one can do charity and other CSR work outside Rotary, but I myself can attest that Rotary service is different.



For our projects, this may sound the same as last week but with a few updates.

For our Gift of Life program, we have already done 218 surgeries. We have also so far provided for this rotary year 1,856 guaranteed medical assistance from Cong. Paul Daza.

For Gift of Mobility, casting and provision of limbs for 10 patients was done yesterday at SPED Center, Pasig City.

For Gift of Sight, we had the first batch of surgeries already with 9 cataract patients. There will be another batch on May 27. Screening of patients for this is being done every Wednesday.

For mass wedding project, the wedding attires were already distributed to the 26 participating couples. Church rehearsal and confession were completed. lt's definitely happening on Saturday. Join us to witness this beautiful event. And thanks to all those who donated for this project.

And as I mentioned last week, we are working to hold another Likhang Sining event this year.

So that's it for our project updates Keep safe mga kuya ko.

FORETHOUGHT

HEARING

My Dad was many things, inveterate inventor, tinkerer, observer and throughout his life, deaf. Sadly, in his later years, his sight and mind progressively left him too. In my experience, disabilities of any kind or magnitude often means people tend to overcompensate in other aspects of their lives.

To illustrate, I recall this story from a book called **How to Win Friends and Influence People by Dale Carnegie.**

"There once was a little mouse that got lost in a classroom and caused a great commotion. To the amazement of the class, the teacher enlisted the help of a little boy named Stevie Morris. All the students were surprised because 'Little Stevie' was blind, but the teacher appreciated the fact that 'Little Stevie' had something that no one in the class had - an amazing pair of ears.

In a matter of seconds, 'Little Stevie' had caught the mouse and was the class hero.

Years later in an interview, 'Little Stevie' said that this was the first time that someone had shown appreciation for his ears and accredited his teacher for putting his life on the offensive instead of feeling sorry for himself. According to 'Little Stevie', that day in class was the beginning of his new life.

From that day forward, he developed his gift of hearing and went on to become one of the most influential musicians ever. Stevie Morris doesn't ring a bell? What about his stage name, Stevie Wonder?"

Who is Stevie Wonder? Blind since shortly after birth. He was a child prodigy. Now he's an American singer, songwriter and producer, who is regarded as one of the most successful musicians of the 20th century.

In my view, we're missing vital signs, relentlessly talking, comprehending less.



Given our new reality, we can learn a lot from the hearing impaired community.

Here's four techniques those hard of hearing have deployed for the longest time.

Pace, don't race.

The fastest speakers in the world - the top five, in order - Japanese, Spanish, Finnish, Italian and Korean.

Slowing your delivery allows us time to process information. I'd encourage you to consider convening smaller and shorter online meetings.

Head and shoulders.

Deaf people rely on signs, multiple inputs from people as a whole. On Zoom, we tend to set the camera to capture head and shoulders. Learning from hearing impaired people in our communities, consider a camera re-set - top of your head to your belly button.

Acronyms.

Don't assume everyone on a call knows what DE&I (Diversity, Equity and Inclusion), as an example, means. Or, who Stevie Wonder is, as you've grown up in a different generation.

Dress up.

On Zoom, dress up as we used to, like when attending a meeting in person.

Never wear a shirt with a busy pattern. Looks good in the daylight; not so much on camera, in a low lit room. Consider a plain shirt, with long sleeves; never your favourite Nirvana tour t-shirt.

Presence is what we're all looking for on video calls.
