PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE



ALASDAIR J.W THOMSON President, RY 2020 - 2021

Men of Action!

How do you put a price on something? What currency do you use? How do you know if something is of (good) value?

If you travel a lot, then like me you often spend a lot of time trying to convert between currencies, working out how much something costs in your "own" money as a reference point. So, when a beer cost \$25 in Dubai, that sounds crazy compared to the \$1 it might cost in Manila. But does that make it bad value if income levels in Dubai are 25 times what they are in Manila?

I'm in Busuanga as I write this and have just been to see an island that is for sale. Fifty hectares of beautiful tropical beach, mangroves and a forest covered hill, for a cool US\$5 million. Is that good value when a house in a Makati village might cost the same or more? I know which I'd prefer!

The Economist long ago developed the Big Mac Index as their way of checking cost of living / pricing etc. across countries. How many Big Macs could you buy with a local salary was basically the gist of it – a test of value.

My wife, Chinot, had her own very unique test: you took the price of something and divided it by how many times you were going to use it. If the answer was less than a Pound (we were in the UK at the time), then that was good value. So, for her it was OK to buy an expensive bag if she would use it daily, but not if it would only appear for the odd special occasion.

The Jollibee ice cream cup has for years been my currency of choice in the Philippines. It used to cost just ten Pesos, which helped with the calculations. I get so much pleasure from eating a Jollibee ice cream, so when I'm looking at buying something, I calculate how many of those ice creams I could buy instead and try to figure out if this thing is likely to bring that much pleasure over the time it would take me to eat them all.

Recently, two more meaningful currencies have been on my mind. The first is the life of a child. I've become aware through RCMW that a thousand Dollars is all it costs to save one through our GOL program. So, when I was looking at upgrading my car this year to something swankier it suddenly seemed a value-destructive thing to do, when that money could have saved fifty lives or more. Of course, it could also have bought a quarter million Jollibee ice creams, but even I couldn't eat that many!

The second is Time. It is probably linked to increasing awareness of mortality as the years continue to flow by, but I am now very conscious of how I SPEND TIME. I'm sure it is a feeling that all of us share, but how many of us have the courage to manage our lives by the particular budget? More than any, it is the budget that is absolutely and inevitably limited. When I started managing my Time as a currency I got much better at saying "no" to things that were a waste of it, and much better at embracing things that gave me more value from it. I've become much more conscious of how other people steal my time and how I do the same to others. When someone is late, when a meeting doesn't start or finish on time, I consider it theft.

That is why I am so grateful for all of the Time that all of you dedicate to being a part of this Club and its projects. I realise that it is a true investment of your most valuable currency, and that as your President this year I have a huge responsibility to ensure we manage your investment as frugally and as effectively as we can. But the truth is also that you all have equal responsibility to make the most of the Time you spend in the Club. That time is worth far, far in excess of whatever we pay in our club dues. It can also be one of the best investments we ever make.

I recently was bequeathed a half bottle of this by a friend who was leaving Manila. I wish he had left earlier and done so several times based on my reaction to this whisky. It is SO drinkable. The distillery itself isn't going to win any awards for its beauty, sitting on the site of the old gallows of Elgin (a town where I once ended up in the middle of an all-out pub brawl of the type you used to see in John Wayne Westerns) but the stuff that ends up in the bottle is a fabulous breakfast Speysider. As the distillery sits right on the edge of the River Lossie, from which it draws its water, it is prone to flooding.

Owned by Macdonald & Muir until 2008 it was sold for many years as a budget Glenmorangie (which they also owned), but that woefully underplayed the quality of the drink in my opinion.

Tasting Note by The Chaps at Master of Malt (12y)

Nose: Vanilla-y and sweet, with subtly herbaceous oak developing. **Palate:** Chewy barley with a drizzle of syrup and crushed honey-roasted nuts.

Finish: White chocolate and stacks of apricots.




