PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

'Servant leadership'

As a businessman, I have always been asked about my leadership style. I guess I am the type of leader who loves to encourage and see my people grow.

I'm proudest of our people at DDB Group Philippines who go above and beyond for our clients and the company, while at the same time being able to achieve both professional and personal growth.

As I love to say, there is no better feeling in the world than seeing our people prosper and grow along with the business.

That's what I call purposeful leadership or servant leadership.

Servant leaders lead by serving others, which in business means prioritizing our employees' personal and professional growth and development. We serve our people by empowering them to achieve a shared vision for the future—effectively leading from behind.

Robert K. Greenleaf first introduced the servant leadership philosophy in 1970 when he published his ground-breaking essay "The Servant as Leader", which became widely popular among business and leadership audiences worldwide.

Over five decades old, "servant leadership" is a philosophy that remains popular in today's business because it works! Studies have shown that servant-led companies outperform competitors, have highly engaged employees, and develop future leaders than companies led by CEOs with more traditional "command-and-control" leadership styles.

Servant leadership turns the organizational pyramid model upside down, putting employees and customers at the top, instead of the CEO and other members of senior management. The leader's role becomes that of helping people live according to the company's vision, values, and goals to be successful. In which case, the CEO works for his people, becoming their head cheerleader.

This is what Nelson Mandela meant when he described leadership in his autobiography: "A leader is like a shepherd. He stays behind the flock, letting the most nimble go out ahead, whereupon the others follow, not realizing that all along they are being directed from behind."

That brings me to one of my favorite books, "The Way of the Shepherd" by Kevin Leman and William Pentak.

The book described a Shepherd as a leader who protects, guides or watches over his flock or people, that is, a protector, guardian, and defender.

If your actions protect and inspire people to dream more, learn more, do more, and become more, then you are a shepherd.

The Way of the Shepherd shares the following seven management principles that taken altogether is probably the only leadership plan a CEO would need to steer his flock to the right direction.

Principle 1-Know the condition of your people.

As a leader, you should know what motivates each member of your flock – for whom do they rise for each and every day? Your team's performance will improve significantly as you take the time to discover each person's goals, passions, and struggles.

Principle 2—Discover the SHAPE of your flock.

A good shepherd knows the shape of his or her flock and use this knowledge to help and put them where they can perform best. He or she tries to know their people through their:

S—Strength: Makes sure each person has the skills needed to get the job done.

H—Heart: Confirms each person's heart is in his or her job. Passion leads to purpose.

A—Attitude: Always chooses attitude over skills. Positivity is contagious and creates a team environment.

P—Personality: Places people in positions that reflect their natural strengths and their unique personalities.

E-Experience: Learns about each person's experiences so as to situate this person appropriately in the team.

Principle 3—Help your people identify with you.

Don't hesitate to show your vulnerable side and let your people see the authentic you - your empathy, compassion, and your purpose and passion. Letting your guard down will allow you to build the trust and loyalty of your people.

Principle 4—Make your pasture a safe place.

You must foster an environment where your flock would feel a sense of calm especially when they are uncertain or fearful. Case in point is this pandemic. Create a sense of calm by keeping your people well informed, giving every position importance, and reassuring your sheep by being visible and present.

Principle 5—The staff of direction.

A long, sturdy stick used by a shepherd to manage the flock, the staff represents your responsibility to direct people. As a shepherd, you must always encourage your flock to move to greener pastures, while establishing boundaries. Provide direction using persuasion rather than coercion. Recommend and give ideas; do not dictate or demand.

Principle 6—The rod of correction.

Aside from the staff, the shepherd also carries a shorter stick - a rod, which represents the latter's responsibility to correct them. The shepherd uses the rod in three ways: to protect his or her people from those who will sway







them in the wrong direction; to correct, as an instructional exercise rather than punishment, the flock who are more inclined to listen when they know you've protected them; and to regularly inquire about the progress of your flock knowing that it is your responsibility to develop them.

Principle 7—The heart of the shepherd.

A great leader genuinely cares for his or her people. If you want your people to go above and beyond, they must see your passion, your heart. It is the heart that makes a great shepherd.

It's not rocket science. Love your people and the rest will follow.


