



GUEST SPEAKER MS. JULIA ABAD EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR, PBCWE

Julia Abad has over 20 years of experience working in the fields of politics, public policy, and social development.

At present, she is the Executive Director of the Philippine Business Coalition for Women Empowerment (PBCWE) which advocates for the increased participation and advancement of women in the workplace. She also sits on the Board of Advisors of the Philippine Business for Education (PBEd), and on the Board of Trustees of PHINMA Cagayan de Oro College (COC) and Araullo University.

She was the former Head of the Presidential Management Staff from 2010-2016 and Chief of Staff of then-Senator Benigno S. Aquino III. Prior to her stint in government, She worked as an educator, lecturing in political science and helping to develop a citizenship curriculum for young children. She has also worked in the non-profit sector as a research and communications specialist. She was honoured as a Young Global Leader by the World Economic Forum in 2014 and recognised as one of Manila's 40 under 40 Leaders in International Development by devex.com in 2013.





PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

Gender Equality

Being raised by a single mom, I saw for myself what women can bring to the table when they are given the opportunities to thrive. Women truly have unique capabilities to make things grow and be better.

The number of lives they help extends far and wide from their own family. Communities thrive and the country is stronger because we have women taking care of their families, working in offices, and helping communities.

All kinds of women are special – working moms, housewives, single parents, or singles ready to mingle. When nurtured in an environment where they are valued and given opportunities that are equal to their counterparts from other genders, they are able to actualize their full potential and contribute a lot.

Strong, smart and hardworking, my mother made me a feminist at heart. At a very young age, I learned to respect women, value them, encourage them, and be their cheerleader always.

When I started working, it's when I further realized that women are really special. They run side by side with the men in the organization. There's really nothing that men can do, that women cannot do, and sometimes even better.



In fact, at DDB, we have more female bosses than male ones. In terms of gender composition by level of responsibility, 53% of our executive management, 63% of our senior management, and 65% of our supervisory management are women.

The gender balance scale is somewhat tilted in women's favor. But maybe because of this, we keep on growing and winning. They provide the balance and harmony, the extra care that we all need at DDB.

In return, we provide policies to ensure they can do their work in a safe environment where they feel supported and appreciated. In fact, DDB's creativity-inducing culture of freedom is anchored on the principles of "People First" and "Talent Has No Gender" that altogether inspire and motivate not only our female employees, but all of our people regardless of their gender.

The Philippine Business Coalition for Women Empowerment

In late 2020, we at DDB were introduced to the Philippine Business Coalition for Women Empowerment (PBCWE), a non-profit organization launched by the Australian government's Investing in Women (IW) in partnership with the Philippine Women's Economic Network (PhilWEN) to promote gender equality in the workplace and women's economic empowerment.

Shortly after, we became the first advertising group to be part of the business coalition. As an organization that believes in the high ideals of gender equality, diversity and inclusion, the partnership has further strengthened our advocacy on gender equality in the workplace and brought it to the next level.

Fact is, we want to keep on growing towards becoming a better employer of women, and people of all gender identities for that matter, and be able to do our part in inspiring positive changes towards gender equality and women empowerment.

To tell you more about this, I invited PBCWE Executive Director Julia Abad in today's (August 18) Rotary Club of Makati West's weekly lunch meeting so we will all get to know about the wonderful organization that she leads.

She will talk about workplace gender equality (WGE), diversity and inclusion. And these are things that will not only make our offices kinder and more respectful, but studies show that these also lead to business growth!

In a 2018 International Labor Organization (ILO) enterprise survey of Asia-Pacific enterprises, over two-thirds of respondents said that gender diversity initiatives enhanced their business outcomes in the region with profit increases ranging from 5-20%.

Decades of research have also proven that creating an inclusive and gender equal workplace not only results in improved income, return on investment, and market value, but also increased innovation and resilience, reduced risk, as well as enhanced competitive advantage in attracting investors, consumers, partners, and top talent.

Here are some pointers from Investing in Women on how to achieve workplace gender equality:

Make it clear to all stakeholders that WGE is a priority for your business.

- Set definite WGE targets and hold managers accountable for achieving them.
- Use company data to monitor, evaluate and improve your WGE policies and practices.
- Aim for a balanced representation of women and men at all levels and monitor access to promotions and training opportunities.
- Prevent sexual harassment and discrimination—women and men should feel safe and respected.
- Provide flexible work arrangements and special family leave benefits.
- Support pay equity or equal pay for work of equal value across all genders.

GEARS up

Last year, DDB Group Philippines became the first company in the country and the first marketing communications group in Asia to undergo the Gender Equality Assessment, Results and Strategies (GEARS) program administered by PBCWE.

GEARS is said to be designed for companies to gain a deep understanding of gaps, opportunities,

and strengths of their current strategies in relation to workplace gender equality. It's for a company that holds itself accountable to implement mechanisms that eliminate both direct and indirect discrimination and ensures an inclusive work environment and culture.

It is a business enabling tool, where investing in women ensures overall business productivity and performance leading to growth. It equips organizations to harness the real power in parity and opportunity for all.

The GEARS assessment process is comprised of two stages that utilize statistical data collection and targeted focus area analysis.

After completing GEARS, DDB Group Philippines has shown evidence of leading practice, achieving 100% score in nine out of 10 GEARS focus areas where the company has shown that it comprehensively addresses gender equality by taking an integrated approach.

Getting excellent results in GEARS, especially on meeting the Leading Practice Standards in terms of Strategies and Policies, is a testament to our dedication to provide equal opportunity for all employees regardless of gender, and this is something that DDB Group wants to promote within the advertising industry.

We are currently working on progressing our action plans with PBCWE. And as shown by our GEARS results, we are poised to become a leading advocate in workplace gender equality, diversity and inclusion in the industry.

We truly look forward to working with PBCWE and the business community to further build an economic landscape characterized by equality and more empowered women.

Through all these, I hope I am able to honor the sacrifices of the woman whom I value the most – my mom.


