








ABOUT THE GUEST SPEAKER



MR. DONALD PATRICK LIM
Chief Operation Officer, DITO CME
Chief Innovation Officer, Udenna Corporation

Dr. Donald Patrick Lim is the Chief Operating Officer of DITO CME, and the Chief Innovation Officer of the Udenna Corporation. Prior to his current role, he has served in various leadership capacities in the media, advertising, and digital spaces, having been the Country CEO of Dentsu Aegis Philippines, Chief Digital Officer of ABS-CBN Corporation, Managing Director of MRM Manila, and CEO of Yehey Corporation and Media Contacts Manila.

Dr. Donald is a true student of management, being a product of the management program of the Ateneo de Manila University, finishing his MBA with distinction from Murdoch University, and then moved on to finished his Doctor in Business Administration from the University of Phoenix. Apart from these, Donald also has a diploma in Interior Decorating, a Diploma in Executive Management, and a Diploma in Hotel and Restaurant Management. Finally, Donald has finished Pelmanism from the Pelman Institute in Sydney, Australia. Currently, Dr. Donald teaches eMarketing at the graduate school of De La Salle University and the IMC program at the University of Asia and the Pacific, and Advanced Marketing and Advanced Strategic Management for the doctoral program at San Beda University. He was also an adjust professor in the Asian Institute of Management and Bradford University.

Aside from his full time job now with Udenna, he oversees twelve other businesses of his own, and also does management consulting for up and coming brands and businesses. Dr. Donald is one of the only 24 Certified Professional Marketers in the country, and one of the first in the Philippines to be awarded the Certified Entrepreneur title by the

Canadian Institute of Entrepreneurship. He used to sit as part of the technical panel of the Commission of Higher Education, and has also been awarded the Dr. Bienvenido R. Tantoco Sr. Professorial Chair in Marketing by the Jose Rizal University.

Considered one of the founding fathers of digital marketing in the Philippines, Donald has been awarded by various institutions and organizations, his most recent being awarded the The Outstanding Young Men (TOYM) Award for Community Building in Digital Media. He is the first awardee of the Agora Award for Marketing Communications by the Philippine Marketing Association, a 2015 Young Global Leader conferred by the World Economic Forum, and the only Filipino to receive the DMN 40 under 40 awarded in New York. On top of these, he was conferred Digital Marketer of the Year at the Asian Leadership Awards in Dubai, UAE by the Asian Confederation of Business, the Young Market Masters Award in Online Marketing by Mansmith and Fielders, and is the first recipient of the Digital Leader of the Future award conferred at the World Brand Congress in Mumbai, India.

He is the youngest to serve as President of the Philippine Marketing Association, the biggest gathering of marketing professionals in the Philippines. He is the founding president of the Internet and Mobile Marketing Association of the Philippines. He sat as a board of Governors of the Management Association of the Philippines, and was a past board of director of the Manila Junior Chamber. Finally, Dr. Donald served as a board of Trustee of Operation Smile, a non-profit, volunteer service organization that provides free reconstructive facial surgery for children with cleft lips, and a board of trustee for the World WildLife Fund Philippines.

Dear PP Ruy Moreno,

I wasn't given a chance to personally meet and thank you instead I wrote you a letter to express my sincerest gratitude. It was on your term when my son was operated at PGH on January 19, 2017. Jaden was born with Down syndrome and diagnosed with complex congenital heart disease in which both were difficult to get help. Along the way, i met friends who have child with disabilities and these kids are not priority in our society, they are being prejudiced, discriminated and really heartbreaking. Because of his condition we were always admitted in the hospital which led me heavily in debt and made me decide to go back to middle east and work. One of the hardest decisions i made.

Jaden has a little chance to survive, oxygen dependent for straight 3 months and continued till 7 months until his operation. He was 15 months weighs 5.6kg when he underwent open heart surgery. This made possible because of the generosity of RCMW and GOLI. Without you and the mighty hands of Dr Nicolas and his team, he wont have a successful surgery. You saved Jaden thus the reason why I'm paying it forward.

I couldn't go home when he had an operation due to financial constraints, i stayed the whole day in church before his big day. I prayed "Lord listen to my heart. I'm ready for everything. Pls dont make it hard for jaden. Take him now if you will not allow him to survive. But if he will make it, i promise that i will be grateful each days that he will live. I will commit myself into helping in any forms and pay it forward. I will make sure that people with down syndrome will be prioritized this time. That Jaden will be an inspiration to many"

I created a page called Jaden & Friends to overcome my homesickness. I started to collect preloved strollers, diaper drives and birthday cakes for sick children. From this simple channel grew the cause and endeavors of Jaf. 2 years ago we started a project called happy hearts officially named last Feb 14 during our 1st mission this is in collaboration with Jaden's doctors at PGH.

I focused on kids with down syndrome since they are the most need of help. I make sure that every child who is presented to us will get the care they need and are no longer prejudiced again.

At first it's very difficult to find sponsors to fund their surgeries, we raise funds in our own as well. I kept posting in page, showcasing the kids we assisted, if I'm in the Philippines we conduct seminars, spreading awareness about down syndrome and congenital heart disease. Finally people got to know more about my advocacy and many had known about jaf not only in the Philippines but abroad as well. By always keeping Jaden's page alive and giving always updates i got connected to Congressman Paolo Duterte, his friend who i have the chance to discuss my advocacy and promised to help me so now jaden & Friends is not only a support group but a sponsor also. For referrals, we have almost 300 kids helped. From our own funding we funded 15 kids with ds who are mostly open heart.

So again, thank you Sir Ruy, Sir Rob and members of RCMW. Without you and Goli my son wouldn't be saved from life threatening disease. Now RCMW continues to save more lives referred by Jaden and friends.

Without a doubt, the current economic environment is among the toughest we've ever seen. Your generosity though is still unparalleled. You are...

Paul Harris donations of USD 1,000 are used and matched for our Global Grants, such as our signature project Gift of Life (GOL), the HIV caravans, artificial limbs, cataract, and many more. By giving a Paul Harris, our club is given the opportunity to get more funding for our projects. For example, for the HIV Caravan, RCMW contributed around USD 5,000. With the generosity of RC Singapore West and the Rotary Foundation, we were awarded ~USD 45,000 for the education and testing of HIV in local universities.

5k to 45k. 9x is what we were funded versus what RCMW put in because of the many Paul Harris' by our generous members.

We would like to make you a proposition. Since we cannot physically meet, we have had lunches delivered to us. Each lunch costs roughly ~Php 600. If you would like forgo your lunches during our Zoom meetings, you could save roughly ~Php24,000 (based on 40 lunch meetings per year).




