## GUEST SPEAKER

### DR. GUIDO DAVID

#### FELLOW, OCTA RESEARCH GROUP

Dr. Guido David is currently a Professor of Mathematics at the University of the Philippines.

He obtained his MS Mathematics and Ph.D. in Biomedical Engineering at Texas A&M University.

He served as Director of Computational Science Research Center of the University of the Philippines from 2009 to 2018.

He was also an Adjunct Professor with the Asian Institute of Management's Master of Science in Data Science (MSDS) Program.

In 2010, he was awarded as one of the Ten Outstanding Young Scientists of the Philippines.

His areas of research include Mathematical Modeling, Artificial Neural Networks, Biomechanics, Numerical Analysis, Stochastic Differential Equations, Mathematical Biology, and Game Theory.

In addition to his teaching and research, he also co-hosts Pinoy Scientist on Radyo Agila.

Since April 2020, he has been involved in Covid-19 modeling and forecasting as Fellow of the Octa Research Group.

So I spent the first day of my life as a 65-year-old man sharing life stories with Bro. Bo Sanchez. It was such a great privilege and I heard that participants enjoyed our conversation and had a lot of learnings that they feel they can apply to their respective situations.

Also to celebrate my birthday, my Execom members also shared some traits that they associate with and love about me. These are the lessons they learned from me as a leader. Here is the summary of what they said:

**My faith in God and Humanity.** I've always believed that any business needs a purpose greater than profit (and it also needs a solid profit to serve that greater purpose). My faith has been forged through challenges and I held on to the power of prayers to see us through many obstacles.

**My ability to embrace change.** For me, change coincides with growth and I am relentless in driving both. I guide and support my people through the transformation, and make everyone look forward to change.

**My collaborative and positive attitude.** I see the brighter side of things, and welcome feedback with so much humility. I ask questions, invite inputs and open the team to challenge my ideas. This facilitates critical thinking and ultimately brings forth an empowered team that can think on their own.

**My compassion towards employees.** Putting people first is a strategic business philosophy I espouse, even if it means I have to make personal sacrifices. Especially in 2020, the first year of the COVID-19 pandemic where my mandate was to keep our people safe, we all worked hard to ensure no one lost their job or had to have pay cut, and that everyone felt safe.

My building trusting relationship with people and belief that success is inclusive. I believe that we must lift others up while we climb the ladder of success. You cannot sustain success if you are alone. You need a team with you, and you need to be with your team.

All these are just some of the truths I live by. And I am so grateful that I have people whom I was able to develop and/or inspire to adopt these values and beliefs as well. As they say, leadership is not about having followers, but creating more leaders.

## FORETHOUGHT

### LEADERSHIP & HAPPINESS

One of the highlights of my career was attending my company's corporate university. One of the gifted teachers I had the good fortune of meeting and being taught by was Len Schlesinger (Baker Foundation Professor at the Harvard Business School).

In 2020, Len launched a seven-week **Leadership & Happiness** course (now expanded to 14 weeks).

The value proposition for students is that the most effective leaders do not leave happiness to chance. They manage their own levels of life satisfaction for higher levels of effectiveness and career endurance. And, of course, they manage the well-being of those they lead for both ethical and practical reasons.

As you'd imagine, the course became famous, very fast. Even other business schools are inquiring about the curriculum.

Len is a master at formulating thoughtful leadership-based questions.

Here are three points to ponder.

1. Are you spending a lot of time feeling **disappointed** about what might have been?
2. Are you frittering away a lot of time on the internet trying to get more **certainty** about what is going on in the world?
3. Are you suffering from **loneliness**?



As the weeks go by in the course, Len offers practical action steps surrounding disappointment, uncertainty, and loneliness.

## **Disappointment:**

- **Acknowledge:** I am disappointed, not regretful.
- **Recognize:** I have done nothing wrong and can't change this.
- **Resolve:** I choose to accept the current circumstances and move forward.

## **Uncertainty:**

- **Acknowledge:** I am experiencing fear from uncertainty.
- **Recognize:** I cannot convert this into risk by bingeing on information.
- **Resolve:** I don't know what is going to happen today, tomorrow or next week, but I will not waste the gift of this day.

## **Loneliness:**

- Limit your consumption of social media to no more than 60 minutes each day. Research confirms anything above this level, loneliness and self-destructive behaviours rise. Social media becomes a substitute for relationships.
- Call (not Viber) lonely people you know.
- Make eye contact with quarantine partners or those with you at home, strangers in the street, even your dog.

In conclusion, Len poses some insightful questions around leadership & happiness for us to consider.

1. What is the biggest happiness challenge I have faced in my career to date? How did it affect my career and life?
2. What have I learned about happiness over my career? How would my career be different if I had learned this earlier?
3. Do the current crises in our world provide opportunities to address broader happiness issues in my managerial life?
4. Can I make a strategic plan to come out of the current crisis happier than I went in?

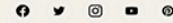

## Rotary International President Elect Gordon McNally visits Rotary Club of Makati West's Gift of Life program

Rotary International (RI) President Elect Gordon McNally recently visited the Philippines to meet with local rotary clubs, with one of the highlights of his trip being his visit at the Rotary Club of Makati West (RCMW)'s Gift of Life (GOL) service project in one of the latter's partner hospitals, the De Los Santos Medical Center (DLSMC) in Quezon City.

Accompanying McNally in the said visit were District 3830 Governor Mildred Vitangcol, Past District Governor Evett Oliván, District Governors Elect from the 10 Philippines Rotary Districts, as well as RCMW officers and advisers: Past Rotary International Director Guiller Tumangan, President Gil Chua, President Elect Dax Carlos, GOL Project Chair Gerry Limcaoco, and Past President Eric Tensuan.

As planned and arranged by District Governor Elect Jay Tambunting III, McNally started his GOL service project visit by observing an ongoing PDA device closure procedure on a three-year old child from Tarlac province, one of the five pediatric patients who had heart procedure that day under RCMW's GOL project. This was followed by a simple program, where McNally learned more about Gift of Life in the Philippines from RCMW, its partners, and its past beneficiaries.

As planned and arranged by District Governor Elect Jay Tambunting III, McNally started his GOL service project visit by observing an ongoing PDA device closure procedure on a three-year old child from Tarlac province, one of the five pediatric patients who had heart procedure that day under RCMW's GOL project. This was followed by a simple program, where McNally learned more about Gift of Life in the Philippines from RCMW, its partners, and its past beneficiaries.

In his speech, McNally said that he had a special "Rotary moment" when he saw first-hand the RCMW Gift of Life project, and realized how the Rotary has been helping save lives by raising funds and through partnerships so that indigent children with congenital heart disease (CHD) could have a chance to live.

McNally compared his Gift of Life rotary moment with what he experienced upon seeing for himself how the Rotary changes the lives of orphans in Rwanda, the street children in South Africa, and the poor children in India.

As a token of appreciation, RCMW President Gil Chua awarded McNally a certificate of donation in the latter's name for the Gift of Life heart procedure he witnessed during his visit.

"We are deeply honored to have RIPE McNally visit our club's Gift of Life project. Just having him spend his precious time with us sends the message that GOL is indeed one of the important projects of the rotary here in the Philippines. It further inspires us to continue with our mission to save lives," said Chua.

Governor Elect Tambunting, who led the RCMW organizing committee for McNally's visit, said that the Rotary International executive's visit was a big boost to the program.

"We thank RI President Elect Gordon McNally for spending time with our club and inspiring us to continue working hard for the Gift of Life program that RCMW started in the country almost two decades ago," said Tambunting.

One of the major projects of the Rotary International, the GOL program was introduced to the Rotary Club of Makati West in 2004 by its Past President Lou Del Rosario, and has since then been helping provide heart surgeries and other procedures to indigent patients suffering from congenital heart disease.

DLSMC President & CEO Elizabeth Dantes and VP for Medical Affairs & Chief Medical Officer Dr. Nilo de los Santos expressed how proud and thankful they are to be one of GOL's partner hospitals. With them were Dra. Louisa Go and Dexter Eugene Cheng, the lead doctors who do the heart surgeries and other procedures with the GOL beneficiaries.

The mother of GOL beneficiary #57 Zeann James, Joyce Tahimic, gave her testimonial during the program. She said her son was born with a heart defect that needs a lifetime of monitoring and medical procedures, which her family could not afford. Through the help of GOL, Zeann was able to undergo his first open-heart surgery in 2006 and was able to have an artificial valve in 2019.

For his part, Gift of Life International President Rob Raylman extolled the volunteerism of the Makati West Rotarians along with hundreds of Rotarians around the world, for making the Gift of Life program a shining beacon of hope for children with heart disease in the developing world.

"In the Philippines, Gift of Life International has forged an amazing partnership with the Rotary Club of Makati West. I thank the Makati West Rotarians for being there every step of the way to help children in need. Because of you, hundreds and hundreds of hearts are being healed every year," said Raylman.
